Numerous items discussed at city council meeting

The City Council met last Monday night with members present, Chasity Wood, Kevin Emter, Preston Foss, Brent Swanson with Wayne Fitterer and Wade Kottre absent.

Mayor Doug Martwick called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance said by all.

The consent agenda was approved and included:

- Minutes from the regular council meeting held on February 9, 2026;
- Minutes from a special council meeting held February 12, 2026;
- The February financial report;
- The mobile home applications from GUMPH; the Glen Ullin Apartments and RV Park; the mobile home park owned by Anthony Schirado.
- The gaming permit from the Glen Ullin Motorcycle Club.
- The council approved the street closure for May 23, 2026 for the Glen Ullin Motorcycle Club Fun Run.
- The March bills presented.

Sid White was present as the city emergency manager and also to discuss the water pressure at his residence. White stated that a weather spotter class will be held in the future and it may be held in Glen Ullin he will let the city know if this happens. There are some people interested in attending and the city should have those spotters in place in case of bad weather, as summer approaches. He also discussed radio's for the city and the council approved purchase of one hand held for the approximate cost of \$2,200. It was noted also that the GU Memorial Park would like an AED which he is looking into.

As far as the water pressure at the White home residence, he along with the city is waiting on Glasser Excavation Inc., to come and camera the area to find the cause of low water pressure.

There were two gravel bids submitted, the council took no action on this.

Chandra Morman with Farmers Union Insurance and who the city has insurance through was present to discuss the new option offered to cities. It is the Public Sewer Back-Up and Water Main Break Coverage Endorsement, designed to support municipalities and their residents when sewer back-ups or water main breaks occur. There are a number of different options to purchase. The city took no action at this time.

In the Maintenance update, the maintenance man will start to burn the cattails at the lagoon and must be done soon along with the burn pile at the landfill. Those will be the top priorities. The scrap and metal pile is cleaned up at the landfill. South Avenue and E Streets will be swept for the county.

The city will apply for a grant from the Glen Ullin Community Foundation for windows for the auditorium.

There was discussion on engineering firms.

The city is looking for a cleaning/janitorial person.

In April the Public Meeting regarding a street project will be held on Monday, April 13 at the city auditorium at 7:00pm.

The regular city council meeting will be moved to Tuesday, April 14 with the Board of Equalization held at 6:30pm followed by the April City Council meeting.

The March school board meeting was held last week with all board members present (Chasity Wood, Mitchell Bettenhausen, Matt Morman, Jill Feser, Andrew Jacobson and Tony Sifuentes.

Feser called the meeting to order with all saying the Pledge of Allegiance and right into the meeting from there.

The student outcomes goal in Math report was given by Superintendent Martin Bratrud. He gave an update on the progress of the students (grades K-2, 3-6, 7, 8 and 10 grades), with growth shown. But there is still room for improvement. He commended the teaching staff and students for putting extra time and effort into this process.
