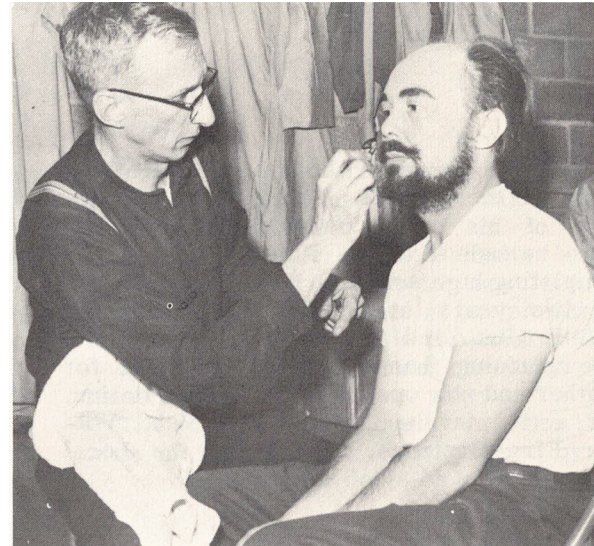


Picture from the past of the Passion Play. King Herod's Court.

MARY

Laura Woeste found it very hard to accept the feminine lead role of Mary with her already busy role of housewife. Since Laura is the mother of seven growing children, an active member with her husband, Victor, of the local square dance club, and president of the Christian Mother's Society, her schedule is heavy.

Once she saw her way clear to accept, she gave the same thoroughness to the delineation of her character that she gives to everything else. Gentle, thoughtful Mary comes alive in her acting. The poignant anguish of the sorrowful Mother was revealed to the audience by Laura's depth of feeling.

CAIAPHAS

The man who originally played the important role of the Christ's opponent in the Passion was Don Wilmes, employed by N.P.

With his great amount of memory work completed, Don began to study his character. He carefully portrayed the weak character of Caiaphas, who was goaded into his actions by his domineering father-in-law Annas. The repellant the audience showed for him was proof of the mastery of his role.

Understudying Don in 1958, Clem Feser, farmer, played two nights and he takes over this year after Don moved to Richardton.

PETER

Ed Fitterer brings to the role of Peter one of the striking realisms of the cast. Peter, the gruff, blundering sincere leader of the Apostles, is a dominant figure of all earlier scenes of the Passion. Slowly and methodically Ed worked on his part until he had the character of Peter portrayed on the Glen Ullin stage. Ed farms north of town.

JOHN

John, the beloved disciple of Christ is played by John Filibeck. John has been an able helper with the CYO besides his regular work as parts man for the Curlew. He is

gentle and considerate; yet with the fire of a quick temper.

MAGDALENE

Fifth grade teacher in the local school system, Betty Lou Gietzen was chosen for the difficult role of the emotional Magdalene. Magdalene is the classic example of the repentant sinner who completely effaced herself in her effort to repair the wrongs of the past. The deep uncontrolled sorrow, so different from that of Mary, goes unchecked during the Way of the Cross. Besides her school work, Miss Gietzen is active in bowling and Youth work. In 1958 Betty left for De Paul and her place was taken by Mrs. Walter Flerer

PILATE

The guiding light of the town's 75th celebration in 1958, past president of the Lions, a key figure of the local water carnival, Joseph Horst, plays the role of Pontius Pilate. The sternness of the Roman soldier coupled with the weakness of his human nature and torn by an offended sense of justice, Pilate appears in the scenes of the Passion. Detesting the Jewish priesthood, but afraid of the condemnation from Rome, he allows himself to be forced to condemn Christ who he was certain was innocent. Joe studied his part well and portrayed Pilate with much accuracy.

HEROD

Frank Morman, former Standard Service man and present elevator man, plays the part of Herod. As a tool in the hands of his wife Herodias, haunted by the old fear of John the Baptist, Herod becomes the pitiful figure of the greatest drama every told. Constant hard work helped Frank bring out these qualities in the play.

ANNAS

J. C., as he is locally known, is one of the outstanding do-it-yourself men of the parish. With hard work he became the leader in the K. of C., Square dance circles, and many other fields. Joachim is a successful farmer and rancher. Mosbrucker endows the part of Annas with marked histrionic ability.

DATHAN

Dathan, the scribe and keeper of the Law, is the hub in the High Council's efforts to get rid of the Christ. Faithful follower of the letter of the Jewish law, he proved to be the relentless antagonist of Christ. Until 1958 Albert Duppong, played his part with great feeling. James Helfrich was given the role when Albert became the understudy of the Christ. Jimmy had three years of dramatic experience at Assumption Abbey School. In 1957 he understudied the part of Caiaphas before he came to his present role. Jim farms with his father south of town and is active with the K. of C., Having charge of their Youth Work.

NATHANIEL

Nathaniel, priest of the Temple, is ably portrayed by Anton Tavis. Not sure of his abilities as an actor, it was hard to convince Tony to accept the part but when he took it over he gave it his best. As a farmer he is known as progressive and hard working. These same qualities helped him make a success of his role. Tony is the Past Grand Knight of the K. C.'s and active in scout work. US Postal Service recommends new prices for July stamps, periodicals

The U.S. Postal Service filed notice with the Postal Regulatory Commission (PRC) of mailing services price changes to take effect on July 12. The new rates include a 4-cent increase in the price of a First-Class Mail Forever stamp from 78 cents to 82 cents.

The proposed adjustments, approved by the governors of the Postal Service, would raise mailing services product prices approximately 4.8%. If favorably reviewed by the Commission, the price changes would include:

The additional-ounce price for single-piece letters will remain at 29 cents. The Postal Service is also seeking price adjustments for other First-Class Mail products, Periodicals, USPS Marketing Mail, Package Services and selected Special Services products.

In the midst of the severe financial crisis facing the Postal Service and continued rising operational

costs, the Postal Service is using all available tools, including available regulatory pricing authority, to ensure we can continue to fulfill our universal service obligation and serve the American public. The Postal Service generally receives no tax dollars for operating expenses and relies on the sale of postage, products and services to fund its operations. Notwithstanding the adjustment, the Postal Service's mailing prices remain among the most affordable in the world.

The PRC will review the changes before they are scheduled to take effect. The complete Postal Service price filing, with prices for all products, can be found on the commission's website under the Daily Listings section. The Mailing Services filing is Docket No. R2026-1. The price tables are also available on the Postal Service's Postal Explorer website at pe.usps.com/PriceChange/Index.
