EZEKIEL AND RABBIE

The sly, quick thinking sub-priest of the temple, Ezekiel and Rabbie, are fast and ready tools of the master mind Annas. Ezekiel, Jerome Gervin, is the local machinist and very able man in his profession. Careful and accurate in his work, he brings these same qualities to the portrayal of his role.

Wally or Walter Morman is another of the farmers of the priest cast. In spite of being a reserved character, Wally makes the complete change in the play to the careful, scheming Rabbie. Walter is active in sports and likes horsemanship most.

BARUCH

The opening lines of the play come from Baruch and Abrion. Cast in the role of Baruch was Jackie Tjaden, garage man and former Vet Commander. He did much to create the atmosphere of the Jewish city life. When Jack moved to Mandan he was replaced by Mike Kobilansky who worked in the crowd scenes. Mike farms south of town. Walter Geck, as Abrion, the tradesman, received his experience in life for Walter runs the Geck's Food Mart. This year Jackie is back.

Loyal members of the Christus following are two members of the Sanhedrin, Nicodemus and Joseph. Cast in these two parts are two brothers, Steve and Joseph Duppong who are farmers on the north of town. Other farmers in the cast include Ray Filibeck as Simon of Cyrene and Lawrence Koller as the blind man.

TEMPLE GUARD

The Temple Guard has only two members, Daryl Gietzen and Gene Morman. They represent the merciless attitude of the Jewish rabble toward Christ. Daryl is with his Father on the farm while Gene is working at

the Super Valu market. One change in this guard was Roger Geck for Gene Morman.

CROWD

The crowd scenes were organized in 1958 to create a more realistic effect with numbers. From the former years group remained Joe Hellman, John Koffler, Matt Schafer, Isidore Glasser, and Clara Hellman. New members coming in now are Tony Schaaf, Kenny Sibla, Mrs. Joe Horst, and Mrs. Mark Hellman. They have done much to bring out the spirit of the triumphant entry of Christ to Jerusalem, the conflict of Pilate, the Way of the Cross and the Crucifixion.

GUARDS

Two of the three former guards, Franz Schafer and Frank Bleth, are ex-service men and active in the Vets organization. Nick Mosbrucker is Milo; also, one of the guards from the first year was replaced by Ernest Fitterer. Three more men were added in 1958: Ed Emter, Daryl Gietzen and Ed Duppong. In 1959 Philip Schlatter, Kenny Sibla and Joe Kuntz join the Roman army of Pilate.

RACHEL AND VERONICA

Rachel and Veronica occupy a place in the inner circle of women around Mary and Magdalena. Both move through the scenes and help develop the deep feeling of sorrow from those still loyal to Christ. Marnie Gauer, Rachel in the play, controls the office work of the M.D.U. and is active in the Auxiliary also. Alma Tavis, Veronica, is active in the Christian Mothers.

SALOME

The dancing daughter of Herod was first portrayed by Janice Schantz in 1956 and 1957 until her marriage and departure from the parish. In 1958 Loretta Fitterer was selected to take her place. Loretta is a high school student active in sports and CYO.

COMPANIONS OF MAGDALENE

The companions of Magdalene, Mrs. Peter Geck, Mrs. Paul Geck, Mrs. Ray Filibeck, housewives and active parish club women complete the inner circle of the Passion Play.

APOSTLES

The Apostles as chosen by Our Lord came mainly from the fisherman, one of the major occupations the. Just as Christ chose His twelve from the then predominating occupation, so we have picked ours mainly from the farmers, Peter Geck, Al and Clem Feser, John Koller, Don Navratil, Gilbert Gietzen are farmers. Joe Tibor manages the family orchestra, Tony Hellman and Adam Gartner are carpenters by trade. Paul Geck replaced J. Tibor in '59.

HEROD'S SLAVES and TEMPLE GIRLS

In the dual roles of Herod's slaves and temple girls are Deana Erhart and Alice Koffler both high school students. Completing the temple girl group are Norman Schultz, Joan Schneider, Corobelle Freitag, Margie Skalsky and Irene Doll who open the play with the symbolic offering to Jehovah. New members of this group are Charlotte Emter, Margie Skalsky, Janice Weiland.


JAPHET
