Track & Field Roundup: A Busy Week of Competition

It was a full week of track and field action as the varsity team competed at two meets this week with sending roughly half the roster on Thursday due to ongoing injuries. Despite limited numbers, athletes delivered standout performances across both events and the coaching staff remains optimistic about returning to full capacity next week.

Bowman County Booster Invite — April 14

After what felt like an endless stretch of grey skies and cold temperatures, the meet in Bowman arrived with sunshine and warmth in the air that finally hinted at spring. The pleasant conditions seemed to bring out the best in the team, as several athletes posted personal records and a pair of first-place finishes highlighted the day.

Marouchka Sako was dominant in the throwing events, claiming first place in both the shot put and discus. Jaxon Rolle turned in an impressive double, winning the 1600 meters outright while also setting the new Bearcat Record with a time of 4:49.25. He also set a new personal record in the 100 meters. Afton Coots was equally busy, finishing second in the pole vault while also setting personal records in the 800 meters and triple jump.

On the women's side, it was a breakout performance day. Noelle Rosendahl, Gia Schafer, and Nora Bassoli all set personal records in both the 100 and 200 meters. Schafer added a PR in the 400 meters as well. Peyton Cotant recorded a PR in the 400 meters, Abby Miller broke through in the 300 meter hurdles, and Tighler Tinney set a new mark in the 100 meters.

Among the men, Eli Foss and Ryan Stern each set personal records in the 100 meters and 800 meters, respectively. Uriyah Dakken notched a PR in the long jump in addition to his 8th-place pole vault finish. Xavier Torres competed in the shot put and discus and placed 8th in both events, and Natalia Schaeffer rounded out the field events with a sixth-place finish in the discus. Jacoby Elmer placed eighth in the 800 meters.

Southern McClean Invite — April 16

Two days later, the team made the trip to the Southern McClean Invite under far different conditions. The morning started cold and blustery, the kind of weather that tests a competitor's resolve before the starting gun even fires. However, the elements settled as the day wore on, and by the time the afternoon events wrapped up, it had turned into a respectable day of competition.

Marouchka Sako again led the way in the throws, repeating as shot put champion and finishing runner-up in the discus. Jaxon Rolle continued his strong week with a first-place finish in the 800 meters. Tighler Tinney had a big day in the field, taking second in the pole vault, while Afton Coots placed third in that same event and added a PR in the 200 meters and a sixth-place finish in the triple jump.

Xavier Torres was one of the busiest competitors on the day, competing in three events and placing seventh in the 800 meters and shot put while finishing fourth in the discus. Uriyah Dakken set a personal record in the 800 meters alongside a seventh-place pole vault finish. Ryan Stern placed seventh in the 3200 meters and set a PR in the 400 meters.

On the women's side, Gia Schafer set a PR in the long jump, Peyton Cotant broke through with a PR in the 100 meters, and Noelle Rosendahl placed seventh in the triple jump. Nora Bassoli also recorded a personal record to close out the meet on a positive note.

Looking Ahead
Despite navigating a shortened roster due to injuries, the team showed depth and determination across both meets this week. With several athletes setting personal records and multiple event wins secured, momentum is building. The coaching staff is hopeful that the full squad will be healthy and ready to compete next week as the season continues to heat up.
