Fireworks can only be discharged within the city of Glen Ullin from **June 27th through July 5th.**

Fireworks cannot be set off before 10:00 a.m. and after 11:00 p.m. local time, except for July 3rd and 4th when it can be discharged until midnight.

Lets be safe this holiday.
Use fireworks outdoors only.
Obey local laws.
Always have water handy. (A hose or bucket).

Only use fireworks as intended.
Never relight a "dud" firework.

Here it is June and time for the Glen Ullin School Board to hold its meeting for the month.

Members present were Matt Morman, Cameron Morman, Chasity Wood, Jill Feser, Andrew Jacobson and Mitchell Bettenhausen. Sifuentes was absent.

President Feser called a special meeting in order to canvass the results from the June 9 election held.

The results included, •

• 3 year term at Large (rural or city): Cameron Morman 125, David Skjoldal 1, Emily Kottre 4, Peter Gietzen .1

• 3 year term (Rural), Mitchell Bettenhausen 106, Marie Bittner 1, Janell Morman 1, Logan Schlatter 3, Andrew Jacobson 1

Those elected Cameron Morman and Mitchell Bettenhausen signed their oath of office presented.

This special meeting was closed and the regular meeting of the school board was called to order with the same members present. The Pledge of Allegiance was said by all with Superintendent Martin Bratrud giving his report on the students outcome goals from the school year. There have been improvements but still more work to be done by students and staff.

The consent agenda was approved and included:

• They approved the minutes from the May 13, 2026 regular school board meeting minutes and the May 1, 2026 personnel committee meeting minutes and May 26, 2026 policy committee meeting minutes.

• the approval of the May bills.
• the financial report
• the budget revisions and manual journal entries.
• the Goal 1 Progress Measure Report.

• the Guardrail Progress Measures

• the approval of the Goal and Guardrail Progress Monitoring Calendar.

• they approved the board meeting calendar, regular board meetings will be on the second Wednesday of each month.

• the board approved the following Policies:

-ACF-Whistleblower Protections Policy; -DGGA-Professional Development Plan Policy; -HCAE-Disbursement of Monies Policy; -HEAA-Line-Item Transfer Policy; -HEBB-Cash in School Building Policy; -HEBC-Fraud Prevention Policy; -AACA-Section 504 Policy; -GAAE-Critical Race Theory (Revised) Policy; -FBA-Student Fees Policy;

•The board approved the resignation of board member Tony Sifuentes effective June 30, 2026.

The following reports included the

superintendents report which included all the reports and dates that they were submitted to the state. The quarter 4 requests for Title 1, Title 1 Transfer, 2024 Title re-allocated monies and Be Legendary grants were all submitted the end of May. The district will apply for Title III funds which have never before been applied for and could have been.

The summer schedule for bus repairs and inspections is ongoing.

The business manager report included, all teacher contracts were paid out in the last period of May; working on getting second quarter final reports; beginning in July will be entering the new teacher contracts into SUI.

Summer help Cindy Schneider has been getting the principal's office ready for the new principal to arrive.

The Summer Meal program seems to be going along okay.

Maintenance report included keeping grass and school yard maintained, buses are getting DOT inspections done at Rud's in New Salem; the air conditioning on both white busses and suburban need repair; the hot water heater in school is not working at present. HA Thompson will be here to figure out the problem and get this fixed. Hard to clean shampoo carpets without hot water.

The electric bus charger has arrived and has been installed. The electric bus will be used the coming school year, primarily for the town bus route.

Some changes may be coming for the rural routes to accommodate incoming prekindergarten families.

A 2026-2027 board calendar was available.

Bratrud gave a report on the financial condition of the district, which is looking good.

The board approved the additional bills presented by the business manager for payment.

The board also approved the Personnel Committee recommendations for the non-certified staff for the upcoming year.

With the resignation of Sifuentes the board will open up application to fill that seat until the next regular election which at that time if that person so chooses can run for the remainder of the term. Superintendent thanked Sifuentes for his dedicated time on the board.

The summer free lunch program has been going good.

The July meeting is the annual re-organizational meeting.

The board approved moving the July meeting to Wednesday, July 29 at 7:00pm instead of the regular day because of conflicts.

The Title I consolidated application was presented and approved.

A finance committee meeting will be held on July 8 at 7pm to go over the budget before presenting it to the full board at the July meeting.
