REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

TO PERFORM CONSTRUCTION ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR CAVALIER COUNTY

BRC-1013(061), PCN 23970

Cavalier County will engage the services of a prequalified engineering firm to perform Construction Engineering on the following project in Cavalier County scheduled to be completed in 2026.

10-114-03.1 is located approximately 0.5 miles North of Hannah, ND on County Road 13 (CMC 1013).

Key project elements include removal of the existing structure. Installation of a precast 16' x 12' x 60' reinforced concrete box culvert with end sections and aggregate surfacing, erosion control and incidentals.

Work to be performed by Consultant includes:

Construction Services: Perform Project Management, Project Administration, Construction Observation, Construction Survey, Materials Testing, and Final Record Keeping. The work will need to follow NDDOT standards and procedures. Additional services, if required, may be negotiated and supplemental agreements issued based on the consultant's performance, the consultant's proposal and available funding.

Firms are invited to submit a proposal for the project listed above. The Proposals shall provide the following information:

Past Performance
Ability of professional personnel
Willingness to meet time and budget requirements
Location

Recent, current, and projected workloads of the persons and/or firms
Related experience on similar projects
Recent and current work for the County
Project understanding, issues, & approach

The proposal pages shall be numbered and must be limited to 10 pages in length. Proposals that exceed the 10 page length requirement will not be considered. The cover letter will not be counted as one of the 10 pages. The proposal should list the personnel who will be assigned to work on the project, including titles, education, and work experience. Cavalier County will only consider proposals received prior to 10:00 AM, April 15, 2026. Late proposals will be deemed unresponsive.

The consultant's proposal may include an appendix. Resumes, references, a statement of qualifications and other materials outlining experience may be included in an appendix. The appendix will not be considered as a part of the 10 page proposal. Each proposal will be evaluated by a selection committee.

Cavalier County will conduct interviews. The County plans to interview up to three (3) of the most qualified engineering firms based on whose proposals most clearly meet the RFP requirements. Interviews will take place on a date to be determined by the County. Firms not selected to be interviewed will be notified in writing.

Fees shall be negotiated with the successful firm. If the fee cannot be

agreed upon, the County reserves the right to terminate negotiations, and then negotiate with the second and third ranked firms in order, if necessary, until a satisfactory contract has been negotiated.

All costs associated with the proposal shall be borne by the proposer. The County reserves the right to reject any and/or all proposals and to not award contracts for any and/or all projects.

attractions will include an ice cream truck, a vendor show near the post office from noon to 6 p.m., and a bingo social in the auditorium. Organizers are also planning recreational activities such as a cornhole tournament and ladder golf.

"We're trying to have things in different areas of town to keep people busy," Diseth said. "We have many things to do outside, so we're hoping for good weather."

A key gathering space for the weekend will be the Edmore School Community Center, which will be open for visitors. The building, which houses memorabilia displays featuring uniforms and awards from past years, holds special significance for residents.

"Everyone's worked so hard to keep it in the city," Diseth said. "It's really important to everyone involved that it stays operational. We want friends and classes to be able to meet there."

The celebration will wrap up Saturday night with live music from October Road and fireworks at dusk.

As word spreads, Diseth said more people have begun reaching out with ideas and contributions, adding to the momentum of the event. "Once we started getting the word out, people started reaching out with things to add," she said.

Although the committee is not formally organizing class or family reunions, many former residents are planning their own gatherings around the celebration weekend. Organizers hope the event will serve as a homecoming of sorts for those with ties to Edmore and also welcome others to town to join in the fun.

Diseth, who returned to the area four years ago with her husband after growing up in the community, said the celebration reflects a broader effort to sustain small-town life. "I think there's kind of a misconception that small towns are slowly dying, and you might think there's not a lot to do," she said. "We're trying our hardest with our neighbors and friends to keep this town going and be able to gather together."

She also expressed gratitude for the volunteers and past organizers who have contributed time, advice, and support.

Rain plans for the event include moving activities indoors to the city auditorium and the Edmore School Community Center.

A final schedule will be released as details are finalized. In the meantime, organizers encourage people to save the date and follow updates through The Borderland Press or the Facebook event page, "Edmore's 125th Celebration."

"We're just so excited to see people in Edmore," Diseth said.
