Absentee Ballots are now available. Absentee Ballot Applications (see sample) have been mailed to active voters. Recent legislation requires the use of this form rather than the green postcards used in the past. If you request a ballot for both the Primary Election AND General Election prior, you will receive your ballot rather than an application. If you did not receive an application and would like to vote absentee, contact the Cavalier County Auditor's office at (701) 256-2229. Applications can be mailed; dropped off at the Auditor's Office; or put in the secure drop box at Cavalier County Courthouse – Door 1. Note: recently updated legislation requires ballots to be received in the Auditor's Office (or the secure drop box) by 7:00 PM on Election Day – November 3, 2026.

Election Day: one polling site will be open on Election Day, November 3, 2026 at the Cavalier County Courthouse, 901 3rd Street, Langdon, ND from 9 AM to 7 PM.
