PL-BC Overcomes 19 Point Deficit
for 63-60 Victory over MLS

The Powers Lake-Burke Central Ranchers had to overcome a second quarter 19 point deficit, 15-34, to overtake the MLS Mavericks for a 63-60 victory. The Ranchers hosted the Mavericks Friday, Dec. 19. The Mavericks hit five treys in the first quarter. With PL-BC down, 8-20, just off the bench Carsen Dosch converted from the low post. As MLS tried for the last shot, Oakley Grubb blocked the three point attempt which landed into the hands of Nate Evenson. Evenson heaved the shot from the opponent's free throw line, scoring the incredible 3/4 court shot at the buzzer, definitely an ESPN highlight reel. Ranchers cut the lead to 13-20 at quarter break. The Mavericks kicked off the second quarter on a 14-2 run. The lone Rancher bucket by Jager Breeding, a baseline float-er. PL-BC fell behind 15-34. Coach Jordan Carlson called a timeout to regroup his guys. And they did just that, making

a 10-3 run, which included 3 scores by Evenson, Jager an offensive putback, and Grayson Rystedt a low post score. This time it was MLS calling for a timeout, 25-37. Breeding hit the last bucket of the quarter, Ranchers down 27-37 at half-time. The Rancher defense came to play in the third, holding the Mavericks to one free throw in the last half of the quarter. Breeding converted two free throws with :57 remaining, tying the game at 45. At :06, Breeding knocked down a trey from the top of the key for the Ranchers' first lead of the game, 48-45, and end of quarter score. The Ranchers boosted their lead to 59-50, hitting 5/6 free throws with 2:46 remaining. MLS cut it quickly, 61-58. A Breeding baseline drive, gave PL-BC a little wiggle room. The Mavericks connected. A Ranch-er offensive foul put the ball in the Mavericks' possession

with 32 seconds left. MLS ran their offense as time winded down. Unfortunately for the Mavericks, their coach called a timeout as one of their play-ers hit from downtown, wip-ing out the tying score with 11 seconds on the clock. MLS was able to put up one more three point attempt. Rystedt grabbed the long rebound, giving the Ranchers the 63-60 victory.
