The Board removed the fees from the previous draft, assigned the fee schedule to the Road & Bridge Department and established a \$250 application fee. A motion by Comm. Holter, second by Comm. Koppelsloen to approve Section 16 of the ordinance as recommended by the Planning and Zoning Board. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried. A motion by Comm. Holter, second by Comm. Koppelsloen to authorize the chairman to sign a residential building permit in Dale Twp. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried. Chairman Van Berkom asked that changes to the ordinances be brought to the County Commissioners before a hearing is held. Spencer Goodman, County Road Supervisor, met with the board.

Spencer requested to follow the fee schedule from Mountrail County for the TUP. A motion by Comm. Holter, second by Comm. Koppelsloen to set road restrictions by noon on Thursday March 19th. Upon roll call, all present voted yes. Motion carried. Spencer sent out the Township Loadpass agreements. The asbestos test results were in for the gym in Flaxton. Asbestos was identified by the furnace and floor tiles in the gym. The pricing to become asbestos certified is \$825 for 5 days of supervisor training and \$675 for 3 days of inspector training. Gravel Products will put up a pile of gravel for the county at the end of the year at the Nordlof pit. One of Spencer's employees will be transitioning to part-time status. It was decided to wait on advertising a position. Spencer is going to gather some quotes on storage containers.

At 10:00 a.m. the bid opening began for project FXP-0716(080). A motion by Comm. Koppelsloen, second by Comm. Holter to open the bids. Bids received were Knife River - \$5,984,450.75; Mayo Construction - \$5,496,042.28 and Central Specialties - \$5,136,793.18. Wold Engineering left the room to review the bids and come back to make a recommendation.

Tracy Stover, Custodian/Maintenance, met with the board.
Tracy reported she received good reviews from the painters that were going to fix the plaster throughout the courthouse. On March 27th the window cleaners will be here.
