County commission continues work towards building improvements

The county commission is continuing to work on upgrading its heating system, with a representative of one of the companies involved giving the officials an update at the Jan. 20 meeting.
There normally would be a requirement by the state’s Century Code for the county to hire an architect for any project over \$250,000 in value.
“The way we do projects is under the Century Code. It basically allows you to hire a program manager to do a guaranteed energy and operational savings contract. All you have to do is advertise for a RFP (Request for Proposal)

for our services or services of companies like us,” Chris Schwab of the Bismarck-based Core Facility Solutions firm told the commission.
“I have written that (RFP) and it is ready to go. The only cost for doing it this way is to advertise. There are no engineering fees,” he added.
“They cannot charge you to submit the RFP. We don’t charge, but I wrote it in that way specifically for you. It is your document and you can change it how you want. I merely drafted it for you. It does not tie you into anything. You are not tied into using us.... it is just a way to meet the bidding requirements.
“If you want to go the other way and hire an architect, that

is still your choice,” he added.
The extent of the needed repairs and upgrades are still being evaluated, according to county officials.
Schwab added that he is still working on applying for a community block grant through the Department of Commerce. “I am going to put that all together with a submission so that Mindy (Schumacher, the county auditor) has it all at once,” he explained.
He said that the plan is to stick with the current boilers the county is using now, but switch to an upgraded version for more energy efficiency.
There are still other parts of the system which will need to be replaced, he added, citing water heater as one example.

BuccaDawgs take fifth at Badlands Classic

The Bowman County/Beach wrestling co-op squad placed fifth in the Badlands Classic held in Killdeer Jan. 23 and Jan. 24.
