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**OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS
SCRANTON CITY COUNCIL**

CALL TO ORDER: The Scranton City Council met at city hall on Monday, July 13th, 2026. Mayor Jason Anderson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. In attendance were Aldermen: Brian Weber, John Pretzer, Ryan Schumacher, Travis Teske; PWS: Tony Dillon; and Auditor: Anne Gruber.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: The pledge was said.

OATH OF OFFICE: Reappointed officials Brian Weber and Ryan Schumacher submitted their Oath of Office forms. Weber and Schumacher actively participated in all subsequent motions on the agenda.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Brian Weber moved to approve the June minutes. Travis Teske seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

AGENDA APPROVAL: Travis Teske moved to approve the agenda for July. Ryan Schumacher seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

FINANCIAL REPORTS: Ryan Schumacher moved to approve the Financial

Reports for July 13th, 2026, the city \$1,273,929.91 and the Parkboard of \$19,846.42. Brian Weber seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

BILLS PRESENTED: John Pretzer moved to pay all bills presented for June. Brian Weber seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

AUDITOR/PARKBOARD REPORT: Discussion on additional uses of Parkboard funds. Past due water customers were discussed. Bulk water billed out in June for \$4,963.70. City sales tax increased from 1% to 2% on July 1st. Added a column to sales tax tracking log for the 1% designated for infrastructure. Brian gave updates regarding the Baseball Programs. The teams did awesome. Both Coach Pitch and Little

League got 2nd place in their respective tournaments. Discussed potential grant opportunities for a score board at the baseball field next year. Community Day is scheduled for July 18th at Murray Park.

PWS REPORT:

Received a Core Main bid to get remote control readers of \$55,000, but a potential for a discount to that amount. Tony has not yet seen how the readers work but will research the possibility of a presentation or training. Got ahold of Steve in City of Bowman, will come in August to jet the sewer lines. The roof on small building south of community center needs to be replaced and will get a bid for the project. Discussed properties that may need to be mowed by the city. City Ordinance states a \$100 charge when the City must mow.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: The letter required by North Dakota Environmental Quality-Drinking Water Program was mailed to residents in June along with a short statement that the City has inspected water lines and found no lead lines. The city received a Memorandum of Understanding to sign related to the \$6,000 from the Play It Forward Grant through BEDC, to be put towards the replacement of the digital sign. Brian Weber moved to accept the first reading of the updated City Ordinances. Ryan Schumacher seconded. Motion passed unanimously. Discussion on Ordinance 8.0202 Transient Merchant License. University student Edyta Gawrysiak inquired about a license to go door-by-door sales. Anne will use the City of Bowman example to create.

NEW BUSINESS:

Brian Weber moved to approve an Off Premise Liquor Permit for the Dakota Territory Car Club, from the Main Bar, for Community Day, July 18, 2026. Ryan Schumacher seconded. Motion passed unanimously. Ryan Schumacher moved to not renew the Living Local application when the annual subscription comes due. Brian Weber seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

ADJOURN: John Pretzer moved to adjourn at 9:02 pm, Travis Teske second-

ed. Motion passed unanimously. The next city council meeting is scheduled for August 10th, 2026.
