

City Council Meeting June 8, 2026

City Office at 7pm

Mayor Olson called the meeting to order at 7pm and pledge of allegiance was recited.

Council members present were Larson, Grundstrom, Weimer, T. Van Camp, Nelson and Halcrow. City employees present were Mattice, DeGeldere and Misialek. Others present were Dylan Ensrude with Moore Engineering, Melissa Abramson with Waste Management, Terry and with Aggie Foundation.

Harold Weimer spoke to the council regarding the Minnesota Circle cul-de-sac width and "berm". He would like to know what the city is going to do and when as 2 homes are being built now and will be occupied in the next couple months. He said that approximately 10 feet of what would be the berm is full of rocks, etc and unable to have grass planted and be mowed.

The city will look into this and get back to Harold with a solution.

Melissa with Waste Management discussed the proposed contract for recycling for the City of Drayton. They have reduced the price per container by \$1.79 per month. They also are agreeing to a 2 year contract. Melissa also answered questions regarding recycling. Several residents also asked questions and informed the city council that they want to keep recycling in Drayton. After a discussion, a motion to approve and sign a 2-year contract with Waste Management was made by T. Van Camp, seconded by Grundstrom. A roll call vote was taken. Those voting yes were Grundstrom, Weimer and T. Van Camp. Those voting no were Larson, Nelson and Halcrow. With the vote resulting in a tie, Mayor Olson broke the tie with a yes vote. Drayton will keep recycling.

Jeff Blawat from the golf course board asked the board for \$2000 to gravel the road to the golf course. Motion to approve paying \$2000 to the Drayton Golf Course from the Tourism (improvement) fund was

made by Grundstrom, seconded by Weimer, all in favor. The Drayton Golf Course Board also requested help with water for the golf course this summer as their pipe for reclaimed water is not fixed yet. Motion to approve giving them a discounted price of \$9.50/1000 gal up to a total of 200,000 gals this summer was made by Larson, seconded by Weimer. Larson, Weimer, Halcrow, Nelson, and T. Van Camp voted yes, Grundstrom voted no, motion passed.

Aggie Foundation representatives were here to answer questions that the council had on how much of the money is donated back to the Drayton Community. The council was worried that since Aggie is not local, that they can donate to those outside of Drayton. The City Council would prefer that the Drayton Golf Course organize their own gaming board and get a gaming license, rather than having an outside organization run the gaming at Johnny Bravoz. Golf Course representatives present explained that they had mostly a new board and did not feel comfortable organizing a gaming board at this time. Motion to approve the site authorization for Aggie Foundation for one year was

made by Grundstrom, seconded by T. Van Camp, all in favor.

On behalf of the Park District, Mona Dietrich presented bills from the pool totaling \$31,913.60. She requested that amount from the pool fund. Motion to approve the amount be paid from the pool fund was made by Grundstrom, seconded by Larson, all in favor. Also, on behalf of the Park District, Eric Lutheran said the park board would like to start purchasing new picnic tables for the campgrounds as they can afford them. He asked the city for the cost of 10 tables. Motion to approve giving the Park District \$7,053.27 for the purchase of the tables from the Tourism (improvement) fund was made by Grundstrom, seconded by Larson, all in favor.

DeGeldere presented quotes for street signs on Main Street to be replaced as they are very faded. Motion to purchase these signs was made by Grundstrom, seconded by Weimer, all in favor.

DeGeldere informed the council that concrete pad where the hardware store used to be has some structural issues and needs to be looked at. DeGeldere will have this looked at and bring recommendations to next council meeting.

Motion to approve the Auditor Bond Resolution was made by Larson, seconded by T. Van Camp, all in favor.

Four special event permits were applied for. Motion to approve these permits was made by T. Van Camp, seconded by Weimer, all in favor.

Amber Shablow and Kelly Largent brought an application for a Alcoholic Beverage License for the business of Kember LLC dba Zoo Bar. Motion to approve the application, contingent on it being filled out completely with notarization, was made by Grundstrom, seconded by Halcrow, all in favor.

Dylan Ensrude with Moore engineering joined the meeting

via phone. He shared the funding options and strategy for the Infrastructure Project. Motion to approve proceeding with applying for SRF loan was made by Grundstrom, seconded by Nelson, all in favor. Motion to approve the May 4, 2026 minutes was made by T. Van Camp, seconded by Grundstrom, all in favor.
