

Water plant has been running good throughout the month, waiting on a company to come in and install one of the sludge pumps, and Coenen attended a class with North Dakota Rural Water to prepare for his first water operator test.

Dauenhauer made a motion to accept the report. Belquist seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Public Works Superintendent Hirschert presented his report to the commission. Public Works staff have been busy sanding streets and plowing streets. Also Hirschert has been working with City Auditor Presnell on the nuisance vehicle removal letters.

Richter made a motion to accept the report. Dauenhauer seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Commissioners discussed a letter they received from Greg Thomes regarding the intent to build a hangar at the Airport. Attorney Peterson will begin to look into lease options for Thomes.

City Hall was discussed. The City received approval from the Bank of North Dakota for the Infrastructure Revolving Loan Fund. Discussion was held on the current building and what the future plans for it will be. Belquist made a motion to sign the Bank of North Dakota letter acknowledging allocation of loan funds.

Dauenhauer seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Richter made a motion to approve the Journal Entries as presented. Dauenhauer seconded the motion. In a roll call vote, Richter, Dauenhauer, Belquist, voted "aye". No nay votes. Motion carried.

Commissioners did the first reading on the amendment to Chapter 19 Article 1 of the New Rockford City Ordinances.

Richter made a motion to renew CD 107325 into a 6-month

CD at a rate of 3.40% at the Community Credit Union. Dauenhauer seconded the motion. All were in favor. Motion carried.

Macey Wobbelma with the New Rockford Park District was present to discuss updating the Park ordinances with changes the Park Board would like to make. After discussion Attorney Peterson stated he would look into City ordinance and NDCC to see if the City Commission makes the changes or the Park Board

would.

With no further business, the meeting adjourned at 9:49 a.m.

**MINUTES OF EDDY COUNTY COMMISSIONERS**

**EDDY COUNTY COURTHOUSE DECEMBER 2, 2025, 8:30 A.M.**

The meeting was called to order at 8:30 a.m. by James F. Allmaras, Chairperson. Commissioners Dave Gehrtz, Glenda Collier, and State's Attorney Ashley Lies present. The New Rockford Transcript was also represented.

Chairperson James F. Allmaras began the meeting by leading the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Dave Gehrtz made a motion to approve the agenda with additions – adding VSO update, option of tablets, update on trip to Butler Plant, and adding to the Financials and Expenditure and Revenue Budgets both October and November. Glenda Collier seconded the motion, all were in favor. Motion carried.

Glenda Collier made a motion to approve the October and November Financials and Expenditure and Revenue Budgets as presented. Dave Gehrtz seconded the motion. All were in favor, motion carried.

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James F. Allmaras made a motion to appoint Dave Gehrtz as Chairperson and James F. Allmaras as the Vice-Chairperson for the 2026 year. Dave Gehrtz seconded the motion. All were in favor, motion carried.

James F. Allmaras made a motion to close the Courthouse on December 26th and January 2nd in addition to the previously closed days. Dave Gehrtz seconded the motion. All were in favor, motion carried.

There was discussion on purchasing a county vehicle for staff to use for travel. Dave Gehrtz had found a 2024 Ford Edge SEL AWD with 15508 miles with warranty for \$30,000.

Staff compensation for added responsibilities was discussed in regards to wind towers, minimized staffing and shared responsibilities. Dave Gehrtz made a motion to increase the 2026 salaries for: Auditor, Recorder, State's Attorney, State's Attorney Assistant, Tax Equalization and Emergency Manager, 5% for departments and 2.5% for depart-

ment assistance. Glenda Collier seconded the motion. All were in favor, motion carried.

Modification of Zoning Ordinances to require Commission oversight was discussed. SA Lies stated that Zoning Ordinances 7.4.1.3 states that The County Commission is responsible for granting CUPS and 10.1.3.3 of the Zoning Ordinances states if the Zoning Commission finds that the prospective permittee will comply with all requirements, it may, within 30 days after the hearing, issue a permit. SA Lies stated these are conflicting as the permits should be issued by the Eddy County Commissioners.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

In regards to the upcoming 2026 Election year, Glenda Collier made a motion to approve one polling location, The Brown Memorial, open from 8:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. three precincts, City of New Rockford, Rural Eddy County and District 9 and the Election Inspector as Kristy O'Connor. Dave Gehrtz seconded the motion. All were in favor, motion carried.
