"The main reason that I was excited when I was asked to be on the board is because I know the importance of the hospital. It's been always a priority in both of our lives to keep it going and

to always be informed enough to answer people's questions," she says. "I want to be able to let people know that we need to support it. It's the most important thing that a person can do is be supportive of an entity that we really need."

Andrea Muggli lives and works on the family farm near Carson with her husband, Tim. They have three children.

"I accepted the offer to be on the Foundation board because I have a passion for helping others and for building a strong community. We are fortunate to have health care facilities in our communities, and I look forward to working

through the Foundation to support them and our dedicated staff for the betterment of our rural care."

Chris Gathright has been the human resources coordinator at JMHCC for 2.5 years. She has worked at JMHCC for 16 years, previously serving as activities assistant and activities director. She and her husband, George, have four children.

"With the hospital being the biggest employer, we need to be the biggest supporter and the Foundation, that's our leg to stand on. We need to be loud and proud. We're changing the culture that's in the hospital, so that needs to be extended. We need everybody to see that and join in and see how great we can be when we're together, when we stand as one," she says.

Megan Maier lives outside of Elgin with her husband, Alan, and son, Lane. They are also excited to be expecting another child in August. She has been teaching at Elgin-New Leipzig

Public School for 10 years, where she teaches junior high and high school science classes.

"I've had the privilege of living in the Elgin area for 11 years, and from the very beginning, this community has made me feel welcome," she says.

"I was recently asked to serve on the Foundation board, and I said yes because our hospital truly matters to this community. Having access to care close to home – especially in emergencies – is incredibly important, and the hospital also provides jobs for many local families. Those jobs have brought new families into our community and into our school, which is something that matters deeply to me as a teacher. Given the financial challenges the hospital is currently facing, I feel it's important to step up and help keep it here. If we were to lose it, the impact would go far beyond health care. It would affect our entire community, our school

We really spent a lot of time in the hospital with him, so making sure the doors stay open is huge for our family," she says.

Jim Schmidt, who lives near Huff in Morton County, served in the N.D. House of Representatives from 2011 to 2022 and eight of those years on the Appropriations Committee. "It is the only hospital in that region and we have to keep it going and I think I can add to that process and some of the facilitation," he says.

Dennis Rivinius, who worked in the lab at JMHCC from 2003 to 2021, is an Elgin native with four children. He is now retired and still lives on his farm. He serves on the JMHCC board as well as the Foundation board.

"We have to get on the bandwagon if we want to keep our doors open," he says. "The support and Giving Hearts Day and just the other day I got a thank you card thanking me for all my years working at the hospital and being on the board just out of the blue. All that kind of made my day," he says.

The Rev. Mike HarriSon is the pastor for Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church in Elgin. He is originally from northeastern Illinois.

"I understand the necessity of having adequate health care options nearby. It can be the difference between life and death. I feel that we need to help our hospital to survive and to flourish for the benefit of the people in this area," he says.
