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And he's been applying those skills ever since.

While the original turning lathe now rests in the corner unused, the current lathe was purchased new in 1984 and has turned for 23,000 hours.

"And I put in 99% of them," Rueben says. And he has emptied 136 chip pans, each weighing about 400 pounds.

"So, I messed up a lot of iron," he says with a smile.

Even a heart attack 10 years ago didn't slow him, as he was back at work 11 days later.

"I still believe everybody has a destiny. All glory goes to God. That's why I'm here," he

says.

He has cut back on his hours, starting work at 7:30 a.m. and ending at 5:30 p.m., unless there's a job to finish.

"For the first 20 years I worked here, we'd start at 7 in the morning, take an hour off for dinner, come back and work until 6, hour off for supper, come back at 7 and work until about 10," he says. "Clarence and I did that for 20 years. At that time, it was just Clarence and I."

The business is now owned by Clarence's son, Mark, and has seen changes through the generations.

"The technology of farming has changed tremendously. The size

of the equipment is unreal," Rueben says. "Years ago, you had a four-bottom plow and now it's 100 feet.

Where's the end?"

Even so, threads, grooves and angles still have to be exact, as Rueben machines, mills and welds parts into perfection.

"It's very picky work," he says. "There's a lot of math involved."

Rueben points to a

hydraulic block he was able to rethread to work like new again, saving the farmer thousands of dollars to replace the part.

"It's just amazing.

People are very appreciative of what I've done for them over the years," he says. "I've

had some farmers tell me, 'You let me know when you quit, because I'm going to quit farming.'"

Since those early years, Rueben and his wife, Ruth, have grown the family tree, with four children, 12 grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.

"It turned out pretty good," he simply says.

Outside the doors of Stelter Repair, Rueben has also served as the mayor of New Leipzig for 25 years and on the fire department for 54 years. He also still serves on the Tri-Cities Joint Job Development Authority.

Rueben also served for six years in the North Dakota National Guard. As a platoon sergeant, he was deployed to the Zap riot of May 9-11, 1969, when a spring break diversion turned into a full-fledged riot, leading to the deployment of the N.D. Army National Guard.

But through it all, Rueben continued his craft in the corner of Stelter Repair.

"Everybody has a destiny. I figure this is it," he says.
