The Project includes the following Work:

Contract No. 1 - Base Bid: Work generally consists of bonding, mobilization, surfacing removal, base recompaction, and surfacing replacement of the corridors of Main Street, Central Ave, and 6th St NW. The improvements include erosion control, traffic control, removal of 27,789 SY of bituminous pavement, removal of 30,856 SF of millings, removal of 5,335 SF of concrete driveways, removal of 6,975 LF of curb & gutter, removal of 2,018 SF of valley gutter, removal of 10,118 SF of sidewalk, removal of 7,804 concrete pavement, removal of 3,878 concrete base (5" depth), installation of 32,134 SY of bituminous paving (7" depth), installation of 36,541 SY of aggregate base (12" depth), 36,541 of 12" sub-grade preparation, installation of 6,840 SF of concrete driveways, installation of 7,541 LF of curb & gutter, installation of 5,066 SF of valley gutters, installation of 1,574 SY of concrete sidewalks, adjusting manholes, gate valve boxes, inlets, and curb stops, installation of 2 curb inlets and 2 72" manholes, crosswalk restriping, and seeding and maintenance.

Contract No. 1 - Alternate No. 1 - 2nd Ave NE Storm Sewer: Work generally consists of removing existing storm sewer system and installing a new system on 2nd Ave NE. These improvements include removing 2 curb inlets and storm sewer pipe, removing 308 SY of asphalt paving, installation of a catch basin, installation of 4 curb inlets, 2 inlets specials, 2 72" manholes, installation of 55 LF of 30" RCP pipe, installation of boring 36" steel pipe for 241 LF, installation of a 36" RCP FES, installation of 41 CY of NDDOT Grade I riprap, installation of 4,156 SF concrete flume, installation of 308 SY of bituminous paving, concrete replacement, backfilling, restriping, and topsoiling.

Contract No. 1 - Alternate No. 2 - 2nd Ave NE Repaving: Work generally consists of 2" mill and overlay and chip sealing of the roadway on 2nd Ave NE and restriping and reconstructing the intersection of 2nd Ave NE and 1st St NE.

Contract No. 1 - Alternate No. 3 - Valley Gutter & Chip Sealing: Work generally consists of chip sealing of the asphalt pavement in the Base Bid as well as 1st St NE and 5th Ave SE and the installation of a new valley gutter on 2nd St SE and 6th Ave SE.

February 26, 1926
The Golden Valley State Bank of Beach failed to open its doors Tuesday morning and its affairs have been taken over by the state banking department. The defunct bank is the second oldest in the county, having been established in May 1905 by F.E. Near, who was the principal stockholder. The failure of the bank is thought to be the result of the period of general deflation of several years ago, which resulted in the closing of hundreds of banks throughout the country at that time, this bank being able to hold on a little longer than others.

No one was invited, but everyone is welcome! Well over 350 friends dropped in at the H.E. Daily ranch in the Westerheim community Sunday to help Mr. and Mrs. Daily celebrate their 50th wedding anniversary. They moved to this area in 1907 and homesteaded at the site of their present home.

Final rites were held Monday for John Francis Reilly, retired Medora rancher who passed away February 24 as a result of a heart ailment. They came to North Dakota in the 1890s, where he attended the first school at Medora, during the era of Teddy Roosevelt and Marquis de Mores. He was married June 1906 to Catherine Wagendorf to which union six children were born. One son, Pat, was killed on Guadalcanal in 1942.
