March 2, 2026

Present: President Schiferl, Commissioner Folkerts, Commissioner Haack, Commissioner Stern and Commissioner Wiedrich.
Others Present: Attorney Donovan, PW Director Brousseau, Myra Savelkoul, Auditor Erhardt.
President Schiferl called the meeting to order at 5:30 PM.
President Schiferl led the pledge of allegiance and said the prayer.
Minutes: Commissioner Wiedrich moved to suspend the reading and approve the minutes of the February 16th meeting, as presented, second by Commissioner Haack. Motion unanimously approved.
Agenda: Commissioner Haack moved to approve the agenda, as presented, second by Commissioner Folkerts. Motion unanimously approved.
CONSULTATION WITH ATTORNEY AND ENGINEER
Engineer's Report: The commission reviewed the written engineer's report which contained no action items. There was discussion on the ongoing water service line inventory with no firm amount as the number of residences that still need to be determined. There was then discussion about penalties if the inventory is not completed timely and this would be something determined by the federal government. No further action taken.
Project 2023-01 – Alley Rehab – Resolution Directing Assessment and Hearing on Assessment: The commission reviewed a resolution directing assessment of costs for the rehabilitation of the alley between Central Avenue N and 1st Ave NW, north of Main Street, and a tentative notice of hearing on the special assessments, when determined. Commissioner Wiedrich moved to adopt the Resolution Directing Assessments in the amount of \$275,576.44 and to set a tentative date of June 15, 2026, for hearing on the assessments, second by Commissioner Folkerts. On roll call vote: Wiedrich, "Aye", Folkerts, "Aye", Haack, "Aye", Stern, "Aye", Schiferl, "Aye", motion carried. Full test of the resolution is available for review in the city auditor's office.

Water/Sewer/Garbage: Commissioner Stern had nothing to report at this time.
Street/Cemetery: Commissioner Haack had nothing to report. PW Director Brousseau informed the commission that, weather permitting, street department staff will address the patch spots around the city to bring them back to street level and that crack sealing will begin soon. When asked, PW Director Brousseau indicated the city tar cart was filled prior to completing work last year so we can start this work at any time. PW Director Brousseau also indicated that ash trees will start to be removed as identified in the city's application for the Emerald Ash Borer Mitigation grant.
Finance/Busing/Library: Commissioner Folkerts informed the board that the library is working to bring a mobile museum honoring the US 250th Anniversary and that the museum will be in the city parking lot, west of the library, for the two (2) days it is going to be in Hazen.
Police/Fire/Forestry: Commissioner Wiedrich had nothing to report at this time.
HCD: Myra Savelkoul informed the commission that the HCD board is reviewing ways to provide grants to businesses to return use sales tax dollars locally with an emphasis on purchasing materials locally. Ms. Savelkoul is researching a couple of other grant programs and has, or will be, submitting applications soon. Ms. Savelkoul reported the annual meeting was well attended and a lot of information was provided by various entities with Next Era Energy commenting on how impressed they are with the city of Hazen.
