NDSU Carrington REC Field Day: A recap of events

Farmers, ranchers, crop advisors, horticulturists and others will have the opportunity to see cutting-edge agricultural research come to life through a variety of tours and demonstrations at the NDSU Carrington Research Extension Center Field Day on Tuesday, July 14 near Carrington.

The center's 67th annual field day begins at 9 a.m. with registration, coffee and a welcome. At 9:30, attendees can choose from four concurrent tour options. Lunch will be provided at 12 noon before the afternoon tour begins around 1:30 p.m.

The field day will also celebrate the 100th anniversary of the release of Ceres, NDSU's first hard red spring wheat variety.

The center is also celebrating the opening of the Smart Feed Facility by showcasing the building, equipment and the first research project being completed with the new system.

"This year's event is busier than ever, with a great lineup of experts across all walks of agriculture and celebrating many milestones, as well as the presentation of our Partnership Award," says Mike Ostlie, director of the Carrington Research Extension Center. "There is something for everyone in ag at our 2026 Field Day."

Tours include agronomy, beef production, organic and sustainable agriculture, and horticulture.

Agronomy production NDSU Extension agronomists and specialists will high-

light weed control, plant breeding and agriculture technology on the agronomy tour.
