

Imperials Fall In Dist. Game

In their first Dist. 2 game of the season, the Napoleon/Gackle-Streeter Imperials lost to the Kidder County Wolves 43-53.

In action in Steele last Mon., Jan. 5, the contest was filled with much enthusiasm by both teams. In the first quarter of play, the visiting Imperials held an early 3-2 lead, before the Wolves took the lead to close out the first quarter out in front 10-13.

The second quarter had KC double their lead to hold a 14-20 lead with 4:50 to play in the first half. NGS head coach Paul Erbele and his squad continued to fight their way back into the contest as freshman Brooklyn Schneider hit a trey followed up by a baseline drive to pull NGS to within 2, 22-24 with

1:22 to play in second quarter. Late in this quarter freshman Dawson Erbele picked up her third personal foul as did KC's

Ava Schmidt. Another driving force for NGS was freshman Hope Gross who went 5-6 in this quarter from the charity stripe, as the quarter closed with the Imperials trailing 24-29.

The third quarter the KC full court pressure defense caused numerous Imperial turnovers which turned into layups for KC. However, the Imperials continued to hang with the Wolves as they trailed 33-37 about midway through the quarter. It was also late in this quarter where NGS leading rebounder Dawson Erbele picked up her fourth foul, but remained in the game. The third quarter closed with NGS trailing 34-41.

The start of the fourth quarter had the Imperials still offering a threat as they pulled to within 4, 37-41 after a Schneider trey at the 7:40 mark of the fourth. A couple NGS turnovers led to four quick points for KC as NGS found themselves trailing 37-45 with 6:13 to go. About a minute later Erbele picked up her fifth foul after pulling down a baker's

dozen rebounds. The teams continued to exchange baskets as junior Aliyah Schwartzenberger dropped a triple with 2:00 minutes to go and eighth grader Deziray Zenker hit a triple as well as the Imperials didn't go down without putting up a fight and losing 43-53.

Hope Gross led the Imperials with 18 (including going 9-12 from the line and getting 5 steals). Other Imperials scoring were: Brooklyn Schneider 13 (3-3's), Deziray Zenker 7 (1-3, 4 assists), Aliyah Schwartzenberger 3 (1-3) and Dawson Erbele 2. Seeing action but not scoring was Alaina Nenow.

Wolves scoring were: Taylor Zimmerman 16, Breanah Pfaff 9 (1-3), Riley Sayler 8, Ava Schmidt 8 (2-3's), Ella Witt 7 and Alea Kramlich 5.

From the field NGS shot 7-33 (21%) and KC was 18-33 (55%). From beyond the arch NGS shot 6-16 (38%) while KC was

3-16 (19%). The Wolves held a slight advantage on the boards as they pulled down 36, compared to NGS pulling down 33. The Wolves came away with 15 steals compared to 9 for NGS. In the turnover department NGS had 18 compared to 13 for KC.

From the charity stripe NGS shot 11-14 (79%) while KC was 8-18 (44%). Erbele fouled out for NGS as did Witt for KC.

KGS fall to 5-4 while Kidder County improves to 6-2.
