Easten, Westen, and Suttin Baumgartner competed in the ND USA state freestyle and Greco tournaments on April 25th 2026 in Jamestown.

Suttin competed in the 8u 56# division. He did not make it on the podium but he wrestled hard and is enjoying learning the process.

Westen competed in the 14u 155# division and he came away with 1st place in both styles. This also gave Westen the 2026 Triple Crown award, the 2nd time he's achieved this award. To win this award a wrestler must win the state USA tournaments in your age division in all 3 styles of wrestling which

are folkstyle, which he won in March, as well as freestyle, and Greco/Roman. Winning these state titles makes Westen a 10x ND State USA Champion, he also has finished as a runner up 3x, finished 4th and 5th over the last 5 seasons.

Easten competed in the 16u 138# division where he came home with 2nd place in the Greco division and 1st place in the freestyle division. Easten also was the 16u state folkstyle champion in his age division back in March. Easten is now a 3x ND USA state champion and a 3x runner up, all achieved over the last 2 seasons.

Easten and Westen attend school at Napoleon Public School and wrestle for NPS and Bismarck Gorilla Wrestling Club.

Suttin attends school at HMB and wrestles for Bismarck Gorilla Wrestling Club.

They are coached by Kriss McCleary, Tony Baumgartner and head coach at Gorillas Justin DeCoteau among many others at BGWC.

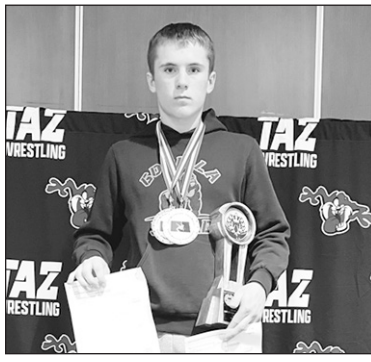

Pepper Steak

Ingredients:

- 1 lb. boneless sirloin steak
- 2 T cooking oil
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1 tsp ginger
- 1 can water chestnuts (sliced)
- 2 T Cornstarch
- 1/2 C soy sauce
- 1/2 C cold water
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. pepper
- 2 green peppers, sliced
- 2 lg. sliced onions
- 3/4 tsp. beef bouillon granules
- 3/4 cup hot water
- 1/2 tsp. sugar

Cut steak into small strips or cubes. Brown steak in oil. Add garlic, ginger, salt and pepper; cook 1 minute. Remove meat and keep warm. Add green peppers and onions to pan; cook and stir for 5 minutes. Dissolve bouillon in hot water. Add bouillon and water chestnuts. Combine cornstarch, soy sauce, cold water and sugar. Stir into pan, add meat. Cook and stir until mixture boils and then cook about 2-3 minutes more. Serve with cooked rice.
