no monetary tips should be accepted/allowed. Kristiansen said she will forward the suggested handbook updates to all commissioners to see what all of them want to do. Schumacher said she would also like the handbook to be reviewed by a third party and will reach out for what fees someone may charge to go through the handbook.

Commissioners reviewed several submitted permit applications for the month. Approved permits included: Dan Pfeifle, Dawson, construct a 60,000 bu. grain bin in Napoleon; Ryan Rivinius, Gackle, construct a grain bin; Jeff and Tawnya Schneider, Kintyre, attached garage; Evan and Jessa Gross, Napoleon, construct a house with attached garage; Royal Force Wrestling Club, restricted event permit at the Napoleon County Club - raffle; Jody Horner, Napoleon, construct a 50,000 bu. grain bin; South Central Water

District, Bismarck, utility permit for portable water pipeline-Napoleon.

Walker requested purchase of a Westlaw contract, which is a digital platform instead of books. Commissioners authorized the contract for around \$370/year, for three years.

Commissioners gave a zoning board progress update, and switched out a few people, as one wanted to be on the board and two people off, making a total board of 10 people. They also amended the approval of the board payment to be funded through the general/miscellaneous fund at \$75/meeting, plus mileage, as noted at previous meetings. The first zoning board meeting will take place on June 29, 2026 at 7:30 p.m. at the Logan County Courthouse.

Commissioners agreed to sell the county's 770 motor grater. They discussed and approved a minimum bid and said it will be advertised several times before opening bids. They also approved to advertise several

times for a full-time highway employee.

KLJ engineer Katie DeWitt attended the meeting to give an engineer's report, updating commissioners on the Burnstad Road project progress, use of Prairie Dog funds and said they plan to submit several applications for grants.

Haylee Viger with the ND Department of Agriculture approached the commissioners about a livestock development planning grant program, tool for planning/zoning. She noted 42 of the 53 counties are on board and have signed up for the ag/farm related grant that would create a map that would show what lands are good, better, and best for livestock development at no cost to the county. Commissioners agreed to move forward to adopt the resolution Viger presented for the grant process. Vigor suggested that the zoning board should hold off on adopting any new livestock ordinances until the process was completed. She expects a

completion date between December 2026 and February 2027.

Wald reported that the Kenworth truck hit a rock and there was damage to the transmission, clutch and PTO housing. A quote of \$7,793 without the PTO housing was received. A prepayment of \$3,500 for JHL Truck Service was requested and approved.

Kristiansen informed the board that a new type of plat had been submitted for approval for recording (it created a subdivision in the county and had a designated spot for Board approval).

Kristiansen researched and found that Century Code gives the Board authority to approve or deny this type of plat with adoption of a resolution. No action was taken; the consensus of the board, with Attorney Walker's input, was that implementing this type of resolution would impose unnecessary restrictions and Logan County doesn't have anything "big enough" at this time that would require this

type of zoning restriction.

Commissioners glanced at a request from the courthouse custodians. The request is to, "make the courthouse parking area cleaner, safer and easier to use, along with more presentable- by professionally stripping the existing concrete pads, creating a clearly marked accessible parking space, reusing the county's rubber wheel stops and establishing a more appropriate location for the cattle scale so the courthouse lawn and parking area remain neat and welcoming to the public." After review of the summary of work, commissioners said they don't have a problem with the current parking lot.

A Six County Meeting is scheduled to be held in Napoleon at the Napoleon Country Club on Tuesday, May 26, while the next regular meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, June 3 at 1:00 p.m., with the county evaluation meeting held at 2:00, at the Logan County Courthouse.
