race for a county commissioner position, as incumbent Blanche Schumacher is being challenged by Cole Johnson. There is also a contest for sheriff as incumbent Andrew Bartholomaeus is being challenged by Kyle Friez. The other offices up for election include County Recorder and County Treasurer. Both incumbents, Laura Henry and Jody Kristiansen are running unopposed. Voters will also be deciding the official county newspaper, which is a position currently held by the Napoleon Homestead and the Homestead is on the ballot.

At the county level, all will advance to the General Election in November.

City wide across the county all results will be final. In the city of Napoleon voters will be electing three city council members. Bob Humann is the only incumbent while Darcy Piatz and Norman Kleppe are the two others on the ballot. A pair of park board members will also be elected, as incumbents Kevin Wolf and Mary Schwartzberger are both seeking reelection.

City of Gackle residents will be electing a mayor as incumbent Andrew Heflin is the lone name on the ballot for that position. A pair of council members are also up for election, as Bradley Pister and incumbent Larry Larson have their names on the ballot. Seeking the municipal judge position is incumbent Paul Hamers. Three names for park board in Gackle on the ballot seeking one of three open positions are incumbents Bill Monson, Tracy Miller and Nichole Seigman.

City of Lehr residents will be voting for a mayor as incumbent Wilbur Zimmerman is seeking that position and incumbents Lexie Dallman and Dawn Dallman are each seeking one of two council member positions. Lehr voters will also be filling a 2-year unexpired council member position held by Kaden Bader whose name is also on the ballot.

Residents in the City of Fredonia will be electing one alderperson as incumbent Terry Rossman is seeking that lone position.

In addition to the county and city races. Patrons in both the Napoleon and Gackle-Streeter school districts have elections on-going as well.

Napoleon school district patrons will be voting for a pair of candidates as both incumbents, Taylor Grunfelder and Corey Schumacher have each filled to fill one of the two 3-year terms. Napoleon patrons will also be asked the question if they wish to continue with the publishing of the official school board minutes.

In the Gackle-Streeter school district voters will see there are two positions up for election. One with a Streeter address and one with a city of Gackle address. Incumbents Sam Miller and Lindi Heflin both have their names on the ballot.
