On Jan. 29, 2002, in his first State of the Union address, President George W. Bush said terrorists were still threatening America — and warned of “an axis of evil” consisting of North Korea, Iran and Iraq.

In 1891, following the death of her brother Kalakaua, Lili'uokalani was sworn in as the first and only queen of the Hawaiian Kingdom. (Her reign would end two years later when the Hawaiian monarchy was abolished following a U.S. military-supported coup d'état.)

In 1936, the first five inductees of baseball's Hall of Fame — Ty Cobb, Babe Ruth, Honus Wagner, Christy Mathewson, and Walter Johnson — were named in Cooperstown, New York.

In 1979, President Jimmy Carter formally welcomed Chinese Vice Premier Deng Xiaoping (dung shah-oh-ping) to the White House, following the establishment of diplomatic relations.

In 1995, the San Francisco 49ers became the first team in NFL history to win five Super Bowl titles, beating the San Diego Chargers, 49-26, in Super Bowl XXIX.

In 1998, a bomb rocked an abortion clinic in Birmingham, Alabama, killing security guard Robert Sanderson and critically injuring nurse Emily Lyons. (The bomber, Eric Rudolph, was captured in May 2003 and is serving a life sentence.)

In 2013, the Justice Department ended its criminal probe of the Deepwater Horizon disaster and Gulf of Mexico oil spill, with a U.S. judge agreeing to let London-based oil giant BP PLC plead guilty to manslaughter charges for the deaths of 11 rig workers and pay a record \$4 billion in penalties.

Valley City Public School District #2 Regular Meeting Minutes
Wednesday, December 17, 2025, at 5:30 PM

Call to Order:
President Sherri Horsager called the regular school board meeting of the Valley City Public School District #2 to order at 5:30 PM on Wednesday, December 17, 2025.

Attendees:
-Board Members Present: Sherri Horsager, Darin Anderson, Ryan Mathias, Phil Hatcher, and Tommy Bergan
-Others Attending: Superintendent

Consent Agenda:
-Bills totaling \$175,292.34 (page 4) and the minutes from the November 12, 2025, regular meeting. 11.25 General Fund, and 11.25 Health Fund.

Motion: Hatcher motioned to approve the consent agenda.

Second: Bergan seconded the motion.

The board approved the agenda as set.

Consent Agenda:
-Bills totaling \$175,292.34 (page 4) and the minutes from the November 12, 2025, regular meeting. 11.25 General Fund, and 11.25 Health Fund.

Motion: Hatcher motioned to approve the consent agenda.

Second: Bergan seconded the motion.

Items for Discussion and Possible Action:
-Stormwater Management Plan for the New School - Hanna Field/Turf Option.

Mr. Johnson discusses that the City of Valley City requires stormwater management for the new school site. There are two options: install water chambers under the parking lot - estimated at \$650K - \$700K or install a stormwater infrastructure beneath Hanna Field. The cost of stormwater management is budgeted in the construction project; however, any cost over and above the budgeted amount would be funded by a sponsorship, not by the bond proceeds. The second option allows for a multi-use, all-weather surface for PE classes, recess for upper grades, football practice, softball, etc. The turf option also reduces the long-term maintenance and increases the uses of the space.

Motion: Hatcher motioned to approve the Facilities Committee recommendation to continue exploring the Hanna Field storm water management and turf option, contingent upon sponsorship for additional costs.

Second: Mathias seconded the motion.

Motion: Upon poll, all present approved, motion carried.
