### Barnes County Commission March 3, 2026 Valley City, ND 58072

The Barnes County Commission met in regular session on Tuesday, March 3, 2026 with Bill Carlblom, Mike Schwehr, Vicky Lovell, Pete Paulson, and Shawn Olauson. Chairman Bill Carlblom called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m., roll call was taken, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited, and the agenda was reviewed.

### Sheriff's Office

Bids were received for a new patrol vehicle. Puklich submitted a bid of \$57,325.00 for a 2026 Chevrolet Tahoe and a bid of \$49,552.00 for a 2026 Chevrolet Silverado 1500. Stoudt-Miller Inc submitted a bid of

\$42,330.00 for a 2026 Dodge Durango with a 3.6L V6 or \$45,148.00 with a 5.7 Hemi; A bid of \$46,864.00 with a 3.3L V6 was submitted for a 2026 Ford Explorer; and a bid of \$49,717.00 for a 2026 Ram 1500 4X4 Crew Cab and a bid of \$49,511.00 for a Ford F-150 4X4. The new vehicle will replace a Durango. Retro-fitting the vehicle would be an additional cost, with cost depending on if current equipment could be used in the new vehicle. After discussion Bill Carlblom made a motion to accept the bid for the 2026 Chevrolet Tahoe; Shawn Olauson seconded the motion. Motion carried with all members voting yes upon roll call vote. Jeremy Wolff, Chief Correctional Officer, would like permission to attend Law Enforcement Training Academy. This is a twelve-week course that he would attend in Bismarck. Melissa would cover his job duties until he returned after the twelve weeks. This course training would allow Jeremy to be a backup for the Sheriff's Department. The county would pay regular wage while he is attending the course. This will be tabled to the next commission meeting on March 17th.

### Weed Board

Jamen would like to phase out the 2015 single axle pickup that is currently being used for spraying by purchasing a new double axle vehicle. A bid of \$47,588.00 for a 2026 Chevrolet Silverado chassis was presented from Puklich. He will check around for flatbed prices. The double axle vehicle would be safer because of the weight shifting of the water tank on the bed of the truck. Bill Carlblom made a motion to approve the purchase from Puklich; Mike Schwehr seconded the motion. The motion carried upon roll call vote with all members voting yes. The highway department may be interested in the 2015 pickup. Jamen does monitor the leafy spurge issue on the land located in the NW¼ of Section 22 in Hobart Township that is owned by the US Forest Service. Beetles were put out last year. He will continue to monitor the issue.

### Auditor's Office

Vicky Lovell moved to approve February 17, 2026, minutes as presented. Shawn Olauson seconded the motion. Motion carried upon roll call vote with all members voting yes. Applications for Abatement or Refund of Taxes were presented and discussed. The City of Valley City Commission Board recommended all applications be approved. The properties submitted for refund of taxes were Parcel #63-3021259 for Valley City Public School District; Parcels 63-3472274 and Parcel #63-3472265 for Thundering Saints Inc.; and Parcels 63-5420600, 63-6040198, 63-4000818, 63-3110126, and 63-4000296 for the City of Valley City. The commissioners felt the property tax should be agreed upon between the buyer and seller of the property and properties should go through the equalization process if the timeline permits. Pete Paulson made a motion to reject all submitted Applications for Refund of Taxes; Shawn Olauson seconded the motion. The motion carried upon roll call vote with all members voting yes.

### Commission Discussion

Pete reported that the Veteran Service Office put 2,588 miles on the van with 40 rides. The mileage on the van is 91,000 plus so we may want to plan for a new van in a year or two. Bob Nelson was driving a veteran to an appointment in Fargo when he was rear ended by another driver on 19th Ave N. No injuries were reported. Bob did submit a police report. This was a hit and run. The road conditions were very icy when this occurred. This has been submitted to insurance. The Weed Board had a 26% increase in chemical prices. Loosestrife weed is under control. Justin and Jamen will be attending a weed conference in Colorado in April. The airport will be taking bids for a runway rehab and paving in front of the tamac. He attended the pipeline meeting in Jamestown. This is currently scheduled to come through Barnes County in 2028. Shawn Olauson attended the Buffalo Bridges Zoning Board meeting. The board voted to have bi-monthly meetings. The state is looking at cases where children are falling in between gaps. Mike Schwehr attended the City County Health District meeting. They are looking at a MOU with the highway department for use of their trailer. The highway department would like to use it as an emergency trailer and equip the trailer with emergency lighting. Tonya came to the CCHD meeting to advise them on some legal matters. Katie is still on leave. Vicky Lovell reported HUD is refurbishing three homes. The library received \$10,000 from Carnegie Corporation. Bill Carlblom attended the pipeline meeting in Jamestown. The pipeline starts with a 40" pipe and drops down to a 32" pipe. Winter Show is this week.

With no further business, Pete Paulson made a motion, seconded by Mike Schwehr, to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried unanimously, with all members voting yes and the meeting was adjourned at 9:32 a.m.


