House majority leader announces retirement

North Dakota's House majority leader will not seek re-election this fall after representing the Dickinson area for more than a decade in the Legislature.

Rep. Mike Lefor, R-Dickinson, issued a statement announcing he will retire after his term ends at the end of November.

“I’ve been in public service for almost 40 years,” Lefor said in an interview. “My family has had to step up to the plate in the business and different events, and I didn’t want that to really continue because I need to do my share in our family businesses.”

Lefor said his family owns some rental property companies that they are looking to expand, and he wants to spend more time with his family.

North Dakota Dem Trygve Hammer announces run for US House

Democrat Trygve Hammer announced he plans to run for North Dakota's lone U.S. House seat for a second time.

Hammer, of Minot, said Republican incumbent Rep. Julie Fedorchak hasn't delivered on campaign promises of addressing affordable housing and health care costs. He also said Fedorchak and Republicans in Congress have failed to provide a check on President Donald Trump's power on tariffs and his perceived war powers.

“There’s a lot of disappointment going on in North Dakota.”

In 2024, Hammer received 30% of the statewide vote while Fedorchak received 70%.

Norsk Høstfest to ceases operations

The board of a Scandinavian heritage festival in North Dakota with a nearly 50-year history this week it has ceased operations and will not host a festival in 2026.

The nonprofit board of Norsk Høstfest said in a social media post the annual event in Minot had become “financially unsustainable,” citing increasing costs and declining attendance.

The Norsk Høstfest festival was founded in 1978 by Minot civic leader Chester Reiten and a group of his friends who wanted to celebrate Nordic heritage, according to the festival nonprofit.
