House majority leader announces retirement

North Dakota's House majority leader will not seek re-election this fall after representing the Dickinson area for more than a decade in the Legislature.

Rep. Mike Lefor, R-Dickinson, issued a statement announcing he will retire after his term ends at the end of November.

"I've been in public service for almost 40 years," Lefor said in an interview. "My family has had to step up to the plate in the business and different events, and I didn't want that to really continue because I need to do my share in our family businesses."

Lefor said his family owns some rental property companies that they are looking to expand, and he wants to spend more time with his family.

At least three candidates plan to run for two seats on the North Dakota Public Service Commission in the 2026 election, with both incumbents announcing campaigns this month.

Commissioner Sheri Haugen-Hoffart announced earlier this month that she will seek re-election to a six-year term.

Haugen-Hoffart was appointed to the PSC in February 2022 and won the election for the seat the same year.

There also is a two-year term on the ballot. Julie Fedorchak was elected to a six-year term in 2022 but she gave up the seat when she was elected to Congress in 2024.

Popular sport

After its introduction in 1965, pickleball became a popular sport in the Pacific Northwest region of the United States and gradually grew in popularity across the country. More than nine million are playing pickleball in the United States.

The growing popularity of the sport is attributed to its short learning curve, its appeal to a wide range of ages and fitness levels, and its low startup costs.

Try it, you'll like it, insists Steve Kourajian.

"You'll be fascinated. It's a fun game to play."

Professional leagues are sprouting up across the country. Pickleball is also growing in popularity outside the United States, with a professional leagues operating in Australia and India.

The two outdoor pickleball courts, with sideline bleacher seating, and a full-size basketball court that were added to Harvey's Veterans Memorial Park last summer. The project was funded by the Aerie Eagles 3080 in Harvey.
