The meeting is being held as a special meeting due to meeting conflicts for the Commission this month. No public comment section will be included during the meeting.

Chairman Dustin Laufer called the meeting to order at 8:00 am

NOVEMBER 10, 2025.  
MINUTES:

Commissioner West moved to approve the minutes of the regular meeting as presented, second by Commissioner Pagel; and by unanimous vote; motion carried.

AGENDA: Commissioner Pagel moved to approve the agenda as presented, second by Commissioner West, and by unanimous vote; motion carried.

OFFICE FEES: Fees collected by county officers were paid to the Auditor/Treasurer for Road and Bridge \$63,151.21, Recorder \$3,113.30, Sheriff \$1294.00

NEXT MEETING DATE: January 13th, 2026, at 8:00 am as the next meeting.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT: Financials were reviewed. SIGNATURE AUTHORITY-END OF YEAR VOUCHERS: Commissioner Pagel moved to approve Commission Chair, Dustin Laufer, to sign any end of year vouchers needed to be paid out of the 2025 budget year, second by Commissioner West, and by unanimous vote; motion carried. The deadline for any vouchers will be Tuesday, December 23, 2025.

911 ADDRESSING: Discussion was had, the Commission decided to ask the fire department or emergency services on their thoughts before going further.

2026 BEER-LIQUOR  
LICENSE:

Commissioner Pagel moved to approve the 2026 Beer/Liquor license for Hettinger Country Club, second by Commissioner West, and by unanimous vote; motion carried.

BOARD APPOINTMENTS: Commissioner West moved to approve the re-appointment of Nicole Sott and Kevin Pagel to the ACDC board, second by Commissioner Pagel, and by unanimous vote; motion carried. One position remains open. Alex Messer requested to be off the REAP board, and one position on the Airport Authority Board will need to have appointments.

GAMING PERMIT: from Hettinger Golf Assn was reviewed for a raffle, Commissioner Pagel moved to approve the gaming permit, second by Commissioner West, and by unanimous vote; motion carried.

COUNTY DEED SIGNATURE  
AUTHORITY:

Commissioner West moved to approve Commission Chair, Dustin Laufer, to sign off on the County deed with 1908 Storage and More LLC for the foreclosed property sold at auction, second by Commissioner Pagel; and by unanimous vote; motion carried.

EVERBRIDGE-PAWS  
ANNUAL CONTRACT  
AGREEMENT:

Commissioner Pagel moved to approve the contract with

Everbridge for the reverse 911 system for Adams County with the annual cost of \$250.00 with \$0.44 per contact per year, second by Commissioner West, and by unanimous vote; motion carried.

JOHNSONS CONTROL  
CONTACT AGREEMENT:

Commissioner West moved to approve the annual contract in the amount of \$5,750.00 for maintenance of the Courthouse boiler system, second by Commissioner Pagel, and by unanimous vote; motion carried.

COUNTY-CITY JOINT  
CONTRACTS:

Updated contracts for Public Works, Auditor, and Tax Director offices were reviewed. Hettinger City Council met yesterday and approved all three. Commissioner West moved to approve the three contracts, second by Commissioner Pagel, and by unanimous vote; motion carried.

EMPLOYEE ANNUAL  
CONTRACTS:

Discussion was had on use of flex time, not very often is it needed. State's Attorney, Aaron Roseland was available for discussion. The Commission questioned if the FSLA changes ever went through creating the need for flex time, Mr. Roseland was not sure at this time. Mr. Roseland discussed the current set-up of flex time should be working unless the department head or any employee is having issues tracking, then the Commission should step in. Commissioner Pagel moved to approve the 2026 employee contracts, second by Commissioner West, and by unanimous vote; motion carried.

ADAMS COUNTY STATE'S  
ATTORNEY:

Aaron Roseland met with the Commission to give updates from his department; things have been quiet in the last couple months. Discussion was had on Sheriff's department deputy vacancy, and if the County should have a contract signed by future deputies to keep commitment to the County helping alleviate costs the county incurs by sending deputies to the Academy. State's Attorney Roseland will work with Sheriff Fisher to come up with a contract; the Commission were all in favor of a contract. Lengthy discussion on medical marijuana and growth, and the future was had.

HETTINGER CITY  
MAYOR:

James Lindquist met with the Commission for any discussion of the joint contracts. The Council approved the contracts and just met with the Commission to see if there was anything else they needed and keep the communication open. Mayor Lindquist thanked the Commission for the great working relationship with the County. The Commission all were in favor of the great relationship as well.

ADAMS COUNTY ROAD  
SUPERINTENDENT:

Justin Blade met with the Commission to provide updates from his department. Mr. Blade has all of his employee agreements completed, besides Tom Arndorfer's, as he is the first part-time employee with flexible hours. Mr. Blade has an instructor planning to come to the County to provide training for his crew. His crew has prepared all the equipment for the winter, so they are ready for the snow season. Brosz Engineering measured all the gravel pits, but this has not been fully completed and

reported yet. It was discussed that in 2027 more gravel will be needed. Mr. Blade is looking for a new motor for his CAT truck, he has been researching costs on the new motor, wiring, etc. Mr. Blade has been working with Seth Tenold for the repairs. Discussion was had on the different routes that can be taken when trying to equip the truck.

BROSZ ENGINEERING:

Lucas Doerr was telephoned into the meeting for discussion due to bad roads. Updates for Country Club Road and Black and Blue Road, final payment applications have been requested. The Commission were questioning if the work had been completed to Country Club Road, Mr. Doerr said we can wait on the last pay application, until the work has been completed. Mr. Doerr will discuss with Martin Construction. The pay application for Black and Blue Road was reviewed; Justin Blade thought the road was completed in good condition. Commissioner Pagel moved to approve the last pay application in the amount of \$2,899.64 for Black and Blue Road, second by Commissioner West, and by unanimous vote; motion carried. Mr. Doerr explained to the Commission that the project came in under budget. Discussion was had on Brosz Engineering has been completing gravel pit surveying. The bid opening for the Schmalztz Bridge project was supposed to be tomorrow, but the NDDOT has pushed this off until January 16<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Doerr did not have any awards for the flex funds; this information should be known by the end of the year.

BRIDGE INSPECTION BRC-

Commissioner West moved to approve the bridge inspection/rating billing from NDDOT in the amount of \$1,668.63 using levied dollars for bridges, second by Commissioner Pagel, and by unanimous vote; motion carried. Discussion was had on several bridges requiring inspection by the Department of Transportation.

OFFICE SERVER:



The reapplication is for three waste stabilization ponds which service the City of Hettinger. The discharge facility is located in the SW1/4, SW1/4, Section 18, Township 129 North, Range 95 West, Adams County. Any discharge would be to Flat Creek, a Class III Stream.

Tentative Determinations

Proposed effluent limitations and other permit conditions have been made by the Department. They assure that State Water Quality Standards and applicable provisions of the FWPCA are protected.
