Nighthawk Boys Head Coach

Unfortunately, the 2025-2026 season of Night Hawk Boys' basketball came to an end this past Saturday with a 54-51 loss to the Beach Buccaneers. Once again, the Night Hawks got off to a cold start in shooting just 1-15 from the field in the first quarter and found themselves trailing by 10 at the end of the first quarter. They fought back and tied the game 30-30 in the third quarter, but another 10-0 run by the Buccaneers made it difficult on the Night Hawks. They fought hard and had a ¾ court shot at the buzzer bounce off the rim to ultimately fall by 3 points.

Gavin Parnow poured in 19 second half points and finished with 21 for the game, and Aidyn Fisher also scored 15 points for the Night Hawks. Parnow was also the leading rebounder for the Night Hawks with 9.

The Night Hawks finished the season with a 5-15 record. Consistency on both ends of the floor

was hard to come by all season long. Like the opening round game against Beach, the team often found themselves in early deficits and struggled to scratch back to find wins. On the season the Night Hawks shot 35.1% from the field and 55.8% from the free throw line.

The Night Hawks had three seniors on this team and they have given so much to the program.

Gavin Parnow was a 2-year starter and 3-year contributor to the varsity team. This season he averaged 9.6 points per game and pulled down 5.5 rebounds per game. For his career, he ended up 12th on the Night Hawk all-time scoring list with 439 career points and set the single season assist record as a junior with 118 assists in the season. Gavin was a solid defender and brought a ton of leadership to the program.

Aidyn Fisher was a 2-year starter for the Night Hawks, and this season he led the Night Hawks in scoring 15.1 points per game and rebounding with 5.9 re-

bounds per game. For his career, he is 9th on the Night Hawk all-time scoring list with 623 career points. Aidyn was a gym rat who ultimately led by example by being in the gym each and every morning working on his game.

Jakob Galbreth is a player that filled his role on the team. He contributed 2.3 points and 3.7 rebounds for the Night Hawks this season. He really developed his footwork in the post and became a solid contributor to the Night Hawks. His experience at the post position will be greatly missed next season.

As for the underclassmen, it is now time to get back to work. We must become a better shooting and finishing team. This comes from reps in the gym, games at the park, and time in the weight room. We have a great core of players coming back and finding that leadership will be crucial to the growth of the program.

The team would like to thank everyone for their support this year. Thank you to Kennedy's Fresh

Foods for the meals we had prepared for the road. We constantly preach nutrition, hydration, and rest in our program, and the food you sent with us on road trips definitely assisted the players in preparing to perform on the court.

Thank you to all the parents and fans of Night Hawk Nation for

bringing the energy and atmosphere to our games. It is amazing how much this support motivates our team. The team will continue to grow in the years to come, and we will remain focused on our most important team goal, representing the communities of Hettinger and Scranton in the most positive way possible.
