for Arbor Day, second by Council Member Burwick, and by unanimous vote; motion carried. Mayor Lindquist declared the Arbor Day Foundation Official Proclamation:

WHEREAS in 1872, the Nebraska Board of Agriculture established a special day to be set aside for the planting of trees, and WHEREAS this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska, and

WHEREAS Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world, and WHEREAS trees can be a solution to combating climate change by reducing the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cutting heating and cooling costs, moderating the temperature, cleaning the air, producing life-giving oxygen, and providing habitat for wildlife, and WHEREAS trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires, and countless other wood products, and WHEREAS trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community, and WHEREAS trees — wherever they are planted — are a source of joy and spiritual renewal. NOW, THEREFORE, I, James Lindquist, Mayor of the City of Hettinger, do hereby proclaim April 24th, 2026, as ARBOR DAY

PUBLIC COMMENT SECTION: Rebecca Ferderer requested to locate the trash cans and benches back on Main Street sidewalks. Discussion was had on if this needs to be requested annually. The Council was in favor of getting them put back out for the season. The CPO gutters will be fixed soon by Hausauer.

HETTINGER SCHOOL ARMORY USE CONTRACT: Council Member Gaylord moved to approve the armory use agreement with the school with no changes from the previous year, second by Council Member Burwick, and by unanimous vote; motion carried.

FLOOD PLAIN ORDINANCE AMENDMENT - FIRST READING: a couple small clerical changes to the Flood Plain Ordinance were requested by the State. Council Member Ebert moved to approve the first reading of the amended flood plain ordinance for Hettinger City flood plain administration, second by Council Member Gaylord, and by unanimous vote; motion carried.

SHARED EMPLOYEE WITH COUNTY: the new employee will have tasks from the city as well as the county. Nathan Nagel will remain in his position and will continue to be a backup for the new employee, Chris Hanson. The city will be responsible for paying Nathan's wage at this

time as well as the hours put in by Chris Hanson.

DANIEL SCHWARTZ: was contacted via telephone for discussion on a few grant opportunities for the city. Mr. Schwartz discussed a brick grant for the Hettinger City project options. The Council will need to decide which project alternate should be applied for, Mayor Lindquist will work with Brosz Engineering and Mr. Schwartz on the information for submission of the grant.

AMERICAN LEGION CONTRACT FOR DEED/LEASE AGREEMENT: The agreement has been signed by both the American Legion as well as the City, starting April 1, 2026, a deposit and first month's rent/taxes have been deposited at the Auditor's office. The American Legion did submit a request for an amendment on the lease, including a possibility of renewal of the short-term lease, credit toward the purchase from the monthly rental payments. Credit would be hard, as the monthly rental amount includes property taxes. The Council was not in favor of extending the lease, as the lease was only temporary to give them the time for financing and time for grant approval.

CUSTODIAL CONTRACT: Trisha Schalesky was brought into the meeting for discussion on her current contract. Options were to re-bid the contract or renew the contract as is. Ms. Schalesky would like to have the position re-bid. Mayor Lindquist, Council Member Gaylord, and Trish will work together to complete a new list of duties to advertise for bidding. Council Member

Gaylord moved to open the position out for bids, second by Council Member Ebert, and by unanimous vote; motion carried. The group will work together after today's meeting to open the position.


BILLS: Council Member Ebert questioned the need to order new meters already, discussion was had on replacement of some meters. Council Member Ebert moved to approve the paying of bills, second by Council Member Burwick, and by unanimous vote.

TAKE NOTICE that the North Dakota Department of Public Instruction (NDDPI) will hold a public hearing to address proposed changes of N.D. Admin. Code 67-15, Modified Public School Calendar; at 9:30 AM on Thursday, June 4, 2026, in the Peace Garden Room at the State Capitol, 600 E. Boulevard Ave., Bismarck, ND 58505.

The purpose of the proposed changes is to amend 67-15-02, Reconfiguration of Instructional Days, to rename the chapter "Four-Day School Week" and to update the criteria for which a school district can be approved to operate under a four-day school week. The proposed rules are not expected to have an impact on the regulated community in excess of \$50,000.
