around her family's own philosophy.

That philosophy drives the name change to Grind Theory Coffeehouse. Rather than a reference to espresso beans, Tuhy intends the name to represent an everyday work ethic—em-

bracing the hard work, the good times, and the bad times to build something better.

The shift in branding brings an overhaul to the kitchen's production. While the shop will maintain the tradition of home-baked donuts, Grind Theory will pivot

heavily toward fresh subs and grinders, featuring deli meats sliced on-site and bread baked in-house. The new business is also serving as a homecoming for the Tuhy family. Tuhy began her teaching career the exact same year her son entered kindergarten; now, as she closes her final elementary chapter,

her son is returning to Hettinger from Minot State University to work as a local loan officer and manage the coffeehouse's finances. Tuhy's daughter will also join the leadership team, stepping in as the shift manager.

Tuhy, who grew up in Belfield, and her husband, a Dickinson native, have called Het-

tinger home since 2002. She credits the town's tight-knit nature as the driving force behind taking such a significant professional risk.

The final day of business under the Peacock Mercantile banner is scheduled for Thursday. Tuhy and her incoming crew of three full-time and three part-time employees will

use the subsequent week to paint, remodel, and rebrand the space.

Grind Theory Coffeehouse will host a soft opening from June 5 to June 6, before launching into a permanent schedule that includes remaining closed on Sundays.

Mail ballots must be received by the county auditor by the close of polls at 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, Jun 9, 2026. Mail ballots can be delivered to the county Auditor's Office or placed in the secure drop box, mail ballots can not be delivered to a polling location.
