Meyhoff asked all to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance and reminded all we will be using Roberts Rule of Order.

Public Comment Session was held: No comments.

Floodplain Maintenance Ordinance. Tabled.

Motion to set the City of Flasher Board of Equalization meeting for April 8th at 7:00 pm CT at the City Hall, to run in conjunction with the regular City Commission meeting. (Kramer/ Gessey) With all voting in favor, motion carried.

Motion to designate Grant

County State Bank and Capital Credit Union as the depositories for the City of Flasher. (Gross/ Gessey) With all voting in favor, motion carried.

Interested candidates can begin gathering signatures. Required forms are available at the City Auditor office. Forms are due by APRIL 6th, 2026 at 4:00 pm to the City Auditor. No forms received after this deadline will be accepted.

Discussed new requirements of elected officials according to NDCC 16.1-09-02. All elected officials now have to submit an annual Statement of Interests and submit it to the City Auditor by January 31.
