lunch there will be 2 assigned elementary staff supervisors for elementary and 2 assigned junior high/high school staff supervisors for high school who will each receive a single meal paid for by the District.

MB-Y, CD-Y, DK-Y, RM-Y, EM-Y. Carried Motion by EM, second by CD that the District will pay for any substitute teacher's breakfast and lunch meals, including seconds if desired.

MB-Y, CD-Y, DK-Y, RM-NV, EM-Y. Carried Motion by EM, second by DK to set the serving times for elementary lunch to begin at 10:50AM and end at 11:10AM, and high school lunch to begin at 11:29AM and end at 11:45AM.

MB-Y, CD-Y, DK-Y, RM-Y, EM-Y. Carried Motion by CD, second by EM to only serve fruits and vegetables as part of the "Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program" as snacks three times a week, along with reimbursable snacks as authorized by the "After School Snacks Program" on days that there are after school activities. No other snacks are approved to be served.

MB-Y, CD-Y, DK-Y, RM-Y, EM-Y. Carried Business Manager, Haylee Kraft, has reached out to the Cooperative Purchasing Connection's North Dakota State School Food Service Coop multiple times over the past week with no joining information response. Motion by EM, second by RM to approve joining the Coop as soon as the information is received and to purchase nearly

exclusively from the winning bidder for the Food Service, with emergency exceptions only MB-Y, CD-Y, DK-Y, RM-Y, EM-Y. Carried Motion by DK, second by EM that every tray served for breakfast for grades K-12 must physically contain a minimum of three of the four food group components to ensure that the meal is reimbursable.

MB-Y, CD-Y, DK-Y, RM-Y, EM-Y. Carried Motion by DK, second by EM that every tray served for lunch for grades K-8 must physically contain a minimum of three of the five food group components to ensure that the meal is reimbursable.

MB-Y, CD-Y, DK-Y, RM-Y, EM-Y. Carried Motion by CD, second by RM that all purchases for the Food Service Fund 05 must be approved prior to the purchase being made. All purchases, including purchases made from the main vendor, will be approved by the Superintendent.

MB-Y, CD-Y, DK-Y, RM-Y, EM-Y. Carried Motion by CD, second by DK to update the pricing for District property rentals to \$75.00 per day for the cafeteria/kitchen, \$75.00 per day for the gym, or \$100.00 per day to rent both.

MB-Y, CD-Y, DK-Y, RM-Y, EM-Y. Carried Discussion was held regarding Social Security taxes on certified teachers. Haylee Kraft reached out to the attorney, who recommended another attorney who specializes in this field. Waiting to hear back in order to present more information on how to move

forward regarding past practices. Motion by EM, second by RM to approve the financial reports.

MB-Y, CD-Y, DK-Y, RM-Y, EM-Y. Carried Reports: Mark Sondag's Principal report covered enrollment numbers, CSI/TSI program updates in regards to funding, student success highlights, along with teacher observations and professional growth.

The Superintendent report was presented by David Mahon and consisted of Impact Aid application progress, Food Service employee update stemming from the NSLP review, food loss due to power outage, security addition construction progress, and student updates surrounding prom, honor roll, and sports.

The Business Manager report was presented by Haylee Kraft and covered NDSBA Winter Summit registration information, summer vandalism insurance claim, open records request, NDSBMC training dates, and policy updates. End of calendar year and beginning of calendar year items were also discussed.


