School Board Proceedings

Minutes of regular meeting of Selfridge Public School District #8 Board of Directors at SHS Tech Room on 01/14/26 at 6:00PM CT.

Present- Monte Becker, President, Christy Deason, Dusty Kraft (via phone @ 6:26pm), Ray Miller, Ed Mosset, Administration Present: David Mahon- Superintendent, Mark Sondag- Principal, Haylee Kraft- Business Manager

President Monte Becker called the meeting to order at 6:00PM CT.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Motion by CD, second by RM to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Visitors included JJ Deason, George Smith, Jason Flack via phone.

Motion by CD, second by RM to approve the December 10, 2025 regular meeting minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

Old Business: George Smith with the Origin Group presented on the latest numbers for the security addition following a meeting with Comstock. The price per square foot is more than expected. A phone call to Jason Flack with Comstock was made at the meeting where Jason explained that this number is preliminary and may change with supply and demand, con-

tractor bidding, etc. George will continue to work with Comstock to make sure this number does not push the project past the \$1,400,000.00 mark that the board is comfortable with.

Motion by RM, second by EM to approve NDDPI's required SFN 52304 "School Construction Approval Request".

New Business: JJ Deason approached the board with interest in purchasing the old elementary school building and the land it sits on. Per attorney guidance citing Attorney General opinions, property owned by a political subdivision must be sold for "fair market value". Motion by RM, second by EM to authorize Superintendent Mahon to hire an appraiser to get the fair market

value of the property and report the findings at the next meeting.

MB-Y, CD-NV, DK-A, RM-Y, EM- Y. Carried Superintendent David Mahon presented on the preliminary National School Lunch Program's 5-year audit findings while still awaiting the official letter of findings from NDDPI. Motion by CD, second by RM to set Tuesday June 9, 2026 as the school board election date.

Discussion was held on the counselor position for the 26-27 school year. Prices from CREA were presented.

Motion by CD, second by EM that for breakfast, there will be 1 assigned supervisor who will receive a single meal paid for by the District and for
