Giving Hearts Day tops \$100,000

The Jacobson Memorial Hospital Foundation raised more than \$100,000 during Giving Hearts Day. That is the largest amount raised by the Foundation during Giving Hearts Day since it began participating in 2015.

Last year, the Foundation raised about \$78,000.

The online event raised funds to support Jacobson Memorial Hospital Care Center (JM-HCC) in Elgin to fulfill a “wishlist” of needed items as well as to raise operational funds.

The total includes a \$20,000 match from First International Bank & Trust in Elgin.

Several donors indicated their wish to purchase certain items on the “wishlist.” Beth Rau purchased the EKG machine for the Richardton Clinic, Julie Schock purchased the phlebotomy cart and Gail Schatz purchased all 10 of the wheelchairs. Moore Engineering donated \$2,000 to assist in purchasing the lifts needed by the hospital. Watch for a further thank you to all donors.

The remaining funds will be used for operational expenses by JMHCC.

“This Giving Hearts Day was heartwarming, as so many showed their support for JMHCC, and

we thank everyone for their generous support,” said Administrator Kristin Heid. “We have donors who return year after year during Giving Hearts Day who we appreciate so much, but we also had many new donors step forward to support this facility. These donations show how committed people are to the hospital and the services it provides to the community.”

With a total goal of \$114,700 to purchase all the items on the needs list and to move JMHCC toward financial sustainability, the Foundation raised a total of just over \$102,000.

they would have them in there three or four hours,” Ackerman says.

Students have shadowed at Gooseneck Implement, with occupational therapists and others.

Through the North Dakota Department of Career and Technical Education, students use RUReady.ND.gov, which guides them through career exploration and planning. There,

they can also access information on local jobs through a business Compass profile.

Ackerman hopes to introduce this option to businesses as well, where they can post local job opportunities for all students to access.

“The whole goal is to keep our workforce, fill all the missing spots,” she says.
