

Hayes Weinberger places at State Wrestling

After months of practice and competing, 12 individual wrestlers of the New Salem-Almont Holsteins boys and girls wrestling teams took their chance to be a potential state champion during last week's State tournament held in Fargo. In the end, no Holstein wound up taking home a state championship at their respective weight class, but seven out of 12 finished in the top eight.

Eight-grader Gunner Fricke, the youngest of all the Holsteins who competed at the state tournament, placed eighth overall at 114

LB. Both freshman and sophomore wrestlers Madison Irwin and Choutae Gerhardt finished in seventh place at their respective weight classes of 142 LB for Irwin and 139 LB for Gerhardt. Senior Keisha Tomac finished in sixth at 124 LB, and sophomore Anna Engwicht would place 5th overall at 130 LB, battling back from a Consolation Semifinal loss and defeating Dickinson's Breanna Erickson by fall. Freshman Chase Becher took third place overall at 107 LB, with his lone loss over five matches occurring to the eventual 107 champion Alberto Verdin.

Junior **Hayes Wein-**

berger would handily take care of his first three opponents to earn a spot in the first-place match at 133 LB against a familiar opponent in Stanley's Cohen Bell, the #1 ranked 133 pounder whom Weinberger had beaten twice prior to the state tournament. Tied 4-4 in an overtime period, Weinberger would lose by sudden victory after being taken down by Bell, placing him in second place overall.

Anna Engwicht earned her 100th career victory during the state tournament, joining Tomac and Weinberger as the third Holstein to achieve the milestone this season.

Recipe: Blondies

Ingredients:

- 12 Tbsp. unsalted butter, melted
- 1 + ½ C. dark brown sugar, packed
- 2 tsp. vanilla extract
- 2 eggs
- 1 + ½ C. all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- ½ tsp. salt
- 2 C. semisweet chocolate chunks, divided

Directions:

Preheat the oven to 350°. Line a 9 or 10 inch square pan with parchment paper, leaving an overhang on each side. Spray with cooking spray. Put the butter and brown sugar into a large bowl and whisk to combined. Whisk in the eggs and vanilla extract until the mixture is smooth. In a bowl, put in the flour, baking powder and salt - stir together. Stir the flour mixture gently into the sugar batter. Fold in 1½ cups of the chocolate chunks. Spread and dough evenly in the prepared pan. Press in the remaining ½ cup chocolate chunks into the top of the dough. Bake for 20-25 minutes until light golden brown and tested down with a toothpick. Cool and use the parchment overhang to remove - put on a cutting board and cut into squares.
