Minutes of the regular meeting of October 22, 2025 were presented. Motion by J. Fleck, second by N. Malm, to approve the minutes. Motion carried with all voting aye.

Financial Reports of the General Fund, Building Fund, Hot Lunch and Activity Funds were presented and reviewed by the board. Motion by S. Schmidt, second by A. Fleck, to approve reports as presented. Motion carried with all voting aye.

Transportation: Discussion was held on: replacing the navigator; activity bus heating issues; transportation committee will meet with Carson committee; cost of contracting activity bus-\$2800.00/day. Motion by S. Schmidt,

second by J. Fleck, to approve the BCBA-Public Participation at Board Meetings policy after the 2nd reading. Motion carried with all voting aye.

Building & Grounds: Discussion was held on: coal boiler, coal auger from storage unit; fire alarm system schematics; tin insert by maintenance area.

Meeting recessed @8:00 PM. Reconvened at 8:07 PM.

Buildings & Grounds cont'd: Updating the football field complex includes pave road; replace crow's nest; replace lights. An application through the community grant for the updates has been applied for.
