

Storm track and field opens season strong in Bowman

The Grant County/Flasher Storm track and field team kicked off its season March 24 in Bowman, turning in a number of solid early performances and personal bests as athletes shook off the rust of a long winter.

Leading the way for the Storm boys was junior Elijah Ottmar, who delivered a standout day in the throwing events. Ottmar placed second in both the shot put and discus, recording a throw of 44 feet, 10 inches in the shot put and 135 feet, 5 inches in the discus. His discus mark surpassed the state qualifying standard, earning him an early trip to the state meet with a qualifying throw of 135'5".

On the track, the Storm saw competitive efforts across the sprint and middle-distance events. In the 200-meter dash, junior Jaxton Olson led the way with a 10th-place finish in 26.30 seconds. Teammates Kyler Rosin (14th, 27.06), Preston Sauer (15th, 27.22), Malachi Meyer (18th, 27.31), Quincey Ottmar (23rd, 28.12), Gavin Ottmar (27th, 29.08), and Micah Meyer (28th, 29.88) rounded out a deep showing for the Storm.

Rosin, Sauer and Gavin Ottmar also competed in the 100 meters, finishing 17th (13.41), 20th (13.46) and 25th (13.74), respectively, each recording personal or season best times.

In the 400 meters, Malachi Meyer turned in one of the top finishes of the day for the Storm, placing fourth in 1:01.04. Quincey Ottmar followed in sixth (1:06.89) and Micah Meyer placed eighth (1:07.83), both earning personal bests.

Distance runner

Mikkel Ostenson posted a time of 6:10.24 in the 1600 meters to finish 12th.

In the field events, Olson added to his strong meet with a second-place finish in the long jump, clearing 18 feet, 3 inches. Grant Bartz placed seventh (16'4"), Preston Sauer eighth (16'2") and Gavin Ottmar 10th (15'4").

Bartz also contributed in the throws, placing seventh in the shot put (35'9") and fifth in the discus (117'5"), both personal best efforts. Sage Sabin added a second-place finish in the javelin with a throw of 128 feet, 1 inch, along with 14th in the shot put and 11th in the discus. Cooper Rafteseth rounded out the boys throwing results with personal bests in both the shot put and discus.

On the girls side, freshman Brynn Janisse turned in an impressive debut, placing fourth in the 100 meters (13.87) and sixth in the 200 meters (30.02). She also earned a runner-up finish in the long jump with a leap of 15 feet, 10 inches.

Senior Adison Vetter delivered a strong performance in the hurdles, placing second in the 100-meter hurdles with a time of 17.84. She also

placed eighth in the javelin (63'0").

In the throwing events, Mykenzie Winkler led the Storm with a third-place finish in the shot put (31'7") and fourth in the discus (88'1"). Cassy Hartman added a fifth-place finish in the shot put (28'5"), sixth in the discus (80'3"), and fourth in the javelin (74'2"), highlighting a strong all-around day.

Additional contributors in the shot put included Brenna Eckroth (8th, 27'11"), Addisen Oien (16th, 24'5"), Sarah Cook (16th, 24'5"), Lydia Sprenger (18th, 24'3"), Kalina Werner (21st, 23'2") and Haleigh Bartz (26th, 19'11"). In the discus, Cook placed eighth (79'8"), Eckroth 11th (75'7"), Bartz 16th (67'2"), Oien 21st (60'10"), Werner 22nd (57'10") and Lydia Sprenger 23rd (54'1").

Hartman led the Storm in the javelin with her fourth-place finish, followed by Vetter (8th), Payton Omlid (9th, 55'7") and Bartz (11th, 37'0").

On the track, Kaylee Maier, Moriah Sprenger, Mirakle Devitt and Shelby Seibel all competed in both the 100 and 200 meters, each turning in personal best performances. Seibel also placed 11th

in the 100-meter hurdles with a time of 22.30, while Sprenger added a ninth-place finish in the long jump (13'3.5") and Devitt placed 12th (12'0").

With one meet in the books and several athletes already posting personal bests — and a state qualifier secured — the Storm showed promising signs to open the season as they look ahead to continued improvement in the weeks to come.

FREE FISHING DAYS Residents of North Dakota may fish without a resident fishing license on Jun. 6-7, 2026, Dec. 26-27, 2026, Jun. 5-6, 2027 and Dec. 26-27, 2027.
