## School Board Proceedings

### BOARD MINUTES FLASHER PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 39 REGULAR MEETING JANUARY 19, 2026

The regular meeting of the board was called to order on the above date at 7:06 P.M. by President Travis Rossow with the following present: Directors Duric Hoff, Nancy Malm, Andrea Fleck, Joe Fleck, CJ Boldt, Supt. JR Wilson, and Business Manager Joyce Miller. Director Sherry Schmidt was unable to attend. Visitor was Sam Poland.

Sam Poland asked that the Seniors be voted on next month's agenda.

Motion by J. Fleck, second Malm, to approve the minutes of the December 22, 2025 meeting. Motion carried with all voting aye.

Financial Reports of the General Fund, Building Fund, Hot Lunch and Activity Funds were presented and reviewed by the board. Motion by A.Fleck, second by J. Fleck, to approve reports as presented. Motion carried with all voting aye.

Sam Poland stated that the FFA Livestock Judging team competed at Nationals in Denver and they are seeking donations for the trip expenses of \$6000.00. Motion by J. Fleck, second by Hoff, to approve

giving \$250.00 each to the 5 students & advisor. Motion carried with all voting aye.

Transportation items: Discussion was held on the status of the bus fleet-bad injector on the activity bus, alarm going off on another, windshield replacement on another. Russ Jones has resigned as a bus driver. There is a backup plan in place if a replacement is not found. A transportation committee meeting will be set up before the next board meeting with Carson.

Buildings & Grounds: Discussion was held on the following: snow removal; cafeteria heater worked on; AVI replaced a pull station; power outages has caused some coal issues; maintenance on bleachers and basketball hoops; playground equipment replacement-utilize the local grant; handrails on the football bleachers; possible black top to access the football field.

Meeting recessed @ 8:20 PM. Meeting reconvened @ 8:24 PM.

Principals Nieuwsma & Krenz report included: Choice Ready-Supt. Wilson explained it-students need to complete 2 of the 3 areas of college, military, & workforce.

School Accountability will

be discussed at February's meeting.

Supt. Wilson discussed: REAP grant of \$50,000.00 and its restrictions on usage; options for open teacher positions; how to help junior high students in their subject areas; and statement of interests from board members required annually.

Discussion on a 4 day school week was held. At the NDSBA Winter Summit in February, that topic will be discussed.

Motion by Hoff, second by J. Fleck, to approve open enrollment applications for 2 students from Roosevelt Public School for the 2025-26 school year and 1 student from Roosevelt Public School for the 2026-2027. Motion carried with all voting aye.

Discussion was held on home school and online courses. Consensus to keep those students enrolled in online courses

Discussion was held on the 2026-27 tentative school calendar. Approval will be at the March meeting.

### UNAPPROVED BOARD MINUTES FLASHER PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 39 REGULAR MEETING - FEBRUARY 10, 2026

The regular meeting of the board was called to order on the above date at 7:09 P.M. by President Travis Rossow with the following present: Directors Joe Fleck, Nancy Malm, Duric Hoff, CJ Boldt, and Andrea Fleck, Principals Brian Nieuwsma and Jamie Krenz, Supt. JR Wilson, and Business Manager Joyce Miller. Visitors were Sam Poland, Paige Zenker, Skye Weinberger, Kacey Isbell, Vicki Krenz, Jill Eckroth (@7:38). Director Sherry Schmidt was not in attendance.

Minutes of the regular meeting of January 19, 2026 were presented. Motion by A.Fleck, second by J. Fleck, to approve the minutes. Motion carried with all voting aye.

Financial Reports of the General Fund, Building Fund, Hot Lunch and Activity Funds were presented and reviewed by the board. Motion by J. Fleck, second by Hoff, to approve reports as presented. Motion carried with all voting aye. Add to the next meeting the 2024-25 Financial Audit.

Members of the senior class, Paige Zenker and Skye Weinberger along with Sam Poland, shared their itinerary for the Senior Class trip in Bismarck on April 1. Discussion was held. Transportation Report: the transportation committee met with Carson's committee-nothing new; both schools are reimbursed for their routes. Re-routing of a bus route which involved eliminating a route when a bus driver resigned. Motion by Hoff, second by Malm, to award the bus bid of \$176,175.00 to Harlow's Bus Sales for a new activity bus. Motion carried with all voting aye.

Buildings & Grounds: Discussion was held on football bleachers railings & ramp work; pour asphalt on gravel road down to football field; get estimates to landscape the hill; different ideas were shared; carpet in the elementary classrooms; elementary girls' bathroom remodel; land north of football field is very soggy-look into drainage away from that area.

Supt. Wilson explained that if students take online classes off campus they are still enrolled as students here. We are receiving per pupil payment

for those students. When a student is homeschooled (paperwork filed), we do not receive per pupil payment for them.

Short recess @ 8:16. Reconvened @ 8:26.

Principals Jamie Krenz and Brian Nieuwsma discussed the following topics: enrollment-elementary-115, high school-126; student engagement surveys are finalizing; professional development on April 22 & May 18; setting up spring testing; data day on February 27; ACT/PreACT testing dates; FFA Winter CDE events have been successful; hydroponic system in ag class; hosting calving school; labor auction was held; FCCLA STAR events winners to compete at the state level in April; Fabulous Fridays in February; Math meet contests; spelling bee local winners; science fair info; poster contests; 4<sup>th</sup> grade Living Ag Day trip; 100<sup>th</sup> day celebrations in elementary; Valentine's day parties; acalympics competitions; T4 Summit for freshmen; scholarship info distributed to seniors; prom is April 18.

AD update: jh boys basketball season wrapping up; state wrestling; girls' basketball upcoming districts & regionals; benefit held for JW Froelich; boys' basketball season ready for districts; spring activities-elem. volleyball, track & field, and boys' golf seasons are getting ready to start.

Supt. Wilson discussed: CTE budget report reimbursement; hands on days reimburse the transportation; Nancy Malm is a member of the Heart River Career Tech Center board; 4 day school week-different options; committee board members-Malm, Boldt, Hoff.

Motion by J. Fleck, second by A. Fleck, to approve open enrollments for the 2025-26 school year with Ft. Yates Public School for one student and open enrollment for 2026-27 school year with Solen Public School for one student. Motion carried with all voting aye.

Discussion on ag education proposal to share costs with Roosevelt.

Motion by A. Fleck, second by Boldt, to approve the following board policy after the 1<sup>st</sup> reading with changes: FCAC-Head Lice; FGDB-Student Handbooks; KACA-Patron Complaints; KACB-Complaints About Personnel; DDC-Unpaid Leave; and DKA-Reduction-In-Force. Motion carried with all voting aye.

The School Accountability Report was reviewed and discussed.

Communications Plan tabled for March's meeting.
