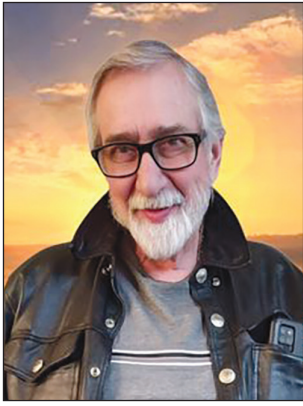


William Redman

Betty Werre

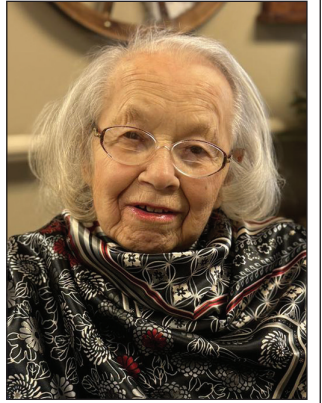

She is survived by brother Edward & Ruth Fried of Mobridge SD and several nieces & nephews and friends.

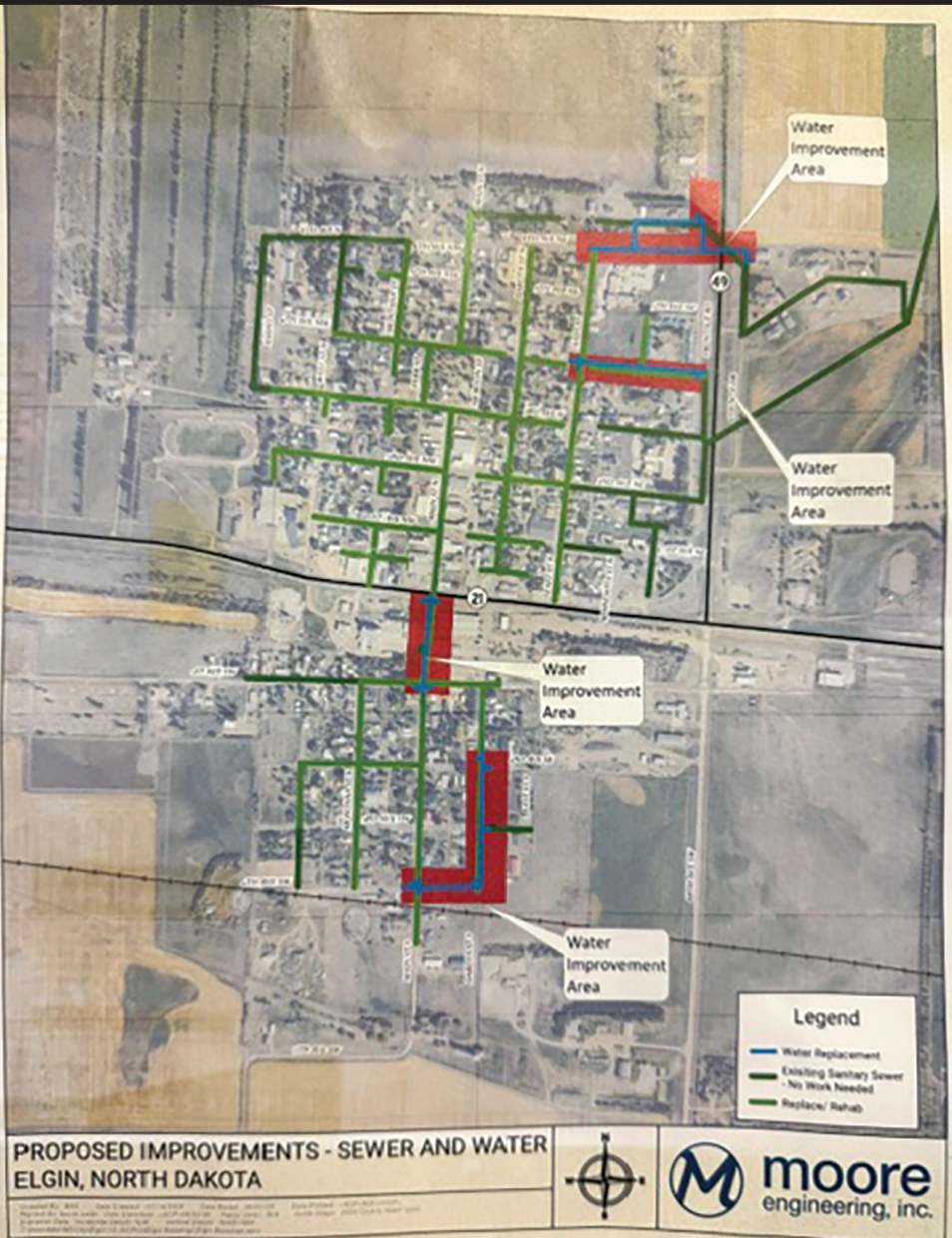
Wilma grew up on a farm south of Elgin. She was married to George Huber on 6th of August 1961. They farmed together and went to thrashing bees and other gathering.
