Council Proceedings

City of Flasher Regular Meeting June 16, 2026

The regular city commission meeting of the Flasher City Commission was called to order at 7:00 pm CT by President Meyhoff. All posting and notification requirements were met. Those present: Commissioners Ternes, Kramer, and Gessey. Absent was Commissioner Gross. Also present were Rhonda Gross, Katie Gross, Stacey Glatt, Abby Rossow, Stewart Merritt and Darrell Erhardt.

Meyhoff asked all to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance and reminded all we will be using Roberts Rule of Order.

Public Comments: Stewart Merritt brought up the gravel on 4th ave that needed to be cleaned up. Requested that it be on the agenda for the next meeting if not resolved by then.

Motion to approve meeting minutes for May 13. (Ternes/Gessey). With all voting in favor, motion carried.

Motion to approve a 1-year lease at \$100 per year for Parcel No. 62-0404205 to Darrell Erhardt. (Ternes/Kramer). With all voting in favor, motion carried.

Auditor Senff informed the commission of the results of the election. Micheal Ternes was elected as Commission President, Skyler Gross & Travis Polensky were elected as Commissioners for full 4-year term, Andy Kuntz was elected as Municipal Judge. The unexpired 2-year commissioner term was not filled via the elec-

tion due to Polensky winning both seats. The commission will need to appoint someone to the Commission to fill the seat. Any person interested in joining the commission should turn in a letter of interest to the City Auditor by July 7th for consideration.

Motion to approve Special Liquor Permit to Franklin Endeavors/The Branded Bar and Grill for July 18. (Gessey/Ternes). With all voting in favor, motion carried. Motion to approve the game permit for Flasher Commercial Club. (Gessey/Kramer). With all voting in favor, motion carried. Discussion regarding upcoming Summerfest. Abby Rossow informed the commission that requests for Summerfest this year are the same, street closure of Main Street from 3 pm – 1 am and water usage for the water park and duck run. Rossow also assured the commission that security for the event has been obtained.

A complaint letter regarding the maintenance of the storm drains from Vicki Doll was read and the commission discussed. The Commission will verify that the storm drains are being properly cleaned out by Public Works.

Motion to publish the fireworks notice. (Gessey/Kramer). With all voting in favor, motion carried. Fireworks are allowed to be discharged within city limits June 27 – July 3 from 9 am to 11 pm, July 4 from 9 am to 12 pm, and July 5 from 9 am to 11 pm.

Motion to remove the insulated portion of the floor in the

shop office. (Ternes/Kramer). With all voting in favor, motion carried.

Motion to issue Force Mow/Weed/Tree Trim letters, as necessary for the summer. (Ternes/Gessey). With all voting in favor, motion carried.

Discussed concerns regarding intersection at Poplar and 2nd. Will consult resources and see what solutions can be made.

Second Reading of Ordinance No. 2026-100 to correct a date in the Floodplain Management Ordinance. This ordinance replaces the date "April 19, 2005" with "October 16, 2015" in section 3.2. Motion to approve the second reading of Ordinance No. 2026-100. (Gessey/Ternes). Roll call vote – all aye. With all voting in favor, motion carried.

Auditor informed commission that repairs were completed for the Bulk Water meter and that it is back in service. Motion to approve invoicing the responsible party for the cost of the parts for the repair. (Gessey/Ternes). With all voting in favor, motion carried. Motion to approve relocating the bulk water meter to the hydrant by the ice rink on Main Street, if hydrant is deemed in proper order to use. (Gessey/Kramer). With all voting in favor, motion carried.

Auditor informed commission of a refund request. Farmers Union Insurance/Brad Doll has been billed for having a dumpster since January and has not had a dumpster since that time. Doll requested a refund or credit for the difference of the charges. The amount totals to \$95. Motion to approve a refund in the amount of \$95 to Brad Doll for the Farmers Union Insurance building. (Gessey/Ternes). With all voting in favor, motion carried.

Discussed Annual Contract with NDSWRA. Tabled

Bid opening for the Pedestrian Trail will be held virtually on July 7 at 10:00 am CT.

Motion approving checks written, except for NDSWRA contract fee. (Kramer/Gessey). With all voting in favor, motion carried. Motion to approve May financials. (Gessey/Kramer). With all voting in favor, motion carried. Motion to approve POs. (Gessey/Ternes). With all voting in favor, motion carried.

Motion to adjourn. (Gessey/Ternes). With all voting in favor, motion carried. Next regular meeting July 7, 2026 at 7:00pm CT at Flasher City Hall.
