Hankinson News 100 YEARS AGO — May 26, 1927

Coming down the home stretch neck and neck Robert Aldrich, Airheart of Fargo, and Maesch of Bismarck, fought out the prettiest finish of any race at the state meet at Grand Forks last Saturday, Alrich winning by six inches in the time of 2:9 1/4. The race was held in the rain, with the track heavy, preventing Robert from making a new state record. He now holds the May festival record in the half mile.

75 YEARS AGO — May 22, 1952

In the second game of the Twin State League schedule the Hankinson Monarchs downed Abercrombie 9 to 3 on the Hankinson baseball diamond

last Sunday, May 18. Abercrombie gathered 4 hits and recorded 5 errors while the Monarchs chalked up 10 hits with only 2 errors. On the mound for Hankinson was Riellan with H. Blad-ow catching. Battery for Abercrombie was O. Gauslow and N. Thailand.

50 YEARS AGO — May 27, 1976

Gary Scheffler of Lake Sand and Gravel, Hankinson, was severely burned over 44% of his body last Friday when a fire blast from the hot mix plant on which he was working hit him. He was rushed to St. Gerard Hospital in Hankinson and then transferred to a Fargo hospital where he is in intensive care and isolation with second degree burns.

They left right after school Friday, accompanied by the scoutmasters, Robert Wander and Jams Schumaker, as well as Pete Retterath. Besides the cleanup job, in preparation for an unusual number of visitors expected at the Fort this summer because of the Dakota Centennial, the boys

enjoyed a fishing contest and a softball tournament, in which the Lidgerwood boys tied for third with a Wahpeton troop.

50 YEARS AGO — May 26, 1977

One person succeeded in adding a bad taste to the kindly reaction after the fire which destroyed all the belongings of the residents of the B and J apartment. During the rummage sale last Friday (apparently) someone went down into the basement of the former Coast to Coast store and opened a water valve in the ceiling of the furnace room. It was left running for almost a week before it was found by the owner, S. Walby. The water flooded parts of the basement and damaged the furnace.
