

REGULAR MEETING – MAY 12, 2026
ENDERLIN AREA SCHOOL DISTRICT 224

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the School Board of the Enderlin Area School District #24 held on Tuesday, May 12, 2026, at the Enderlin School. President Billing called the meeting to order at 7:30 a.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL - ESTABLISH A QUORUM: Paul Billing, Katie Geske, Brian Midthun, Patrick Stansbery and Joshua Warg present.

OTHERS PRESENT: Frank Egan representing The Enderlin Independent, staff members Judith Krueger and Jessica Mark, Anna Fuka, Principal Kayl Hamre, Superintendent Philip French and Business Manager Tammy Boeder.

APPROVE AGENDA: Warg moved, second by Geske, to approve the agenda as printed. By unanimous roll call vote, motion carried.

CONSENSUS AGENDA: Midthun moved, second by Geske to approve the following consensus agenda items: 1) Minutes of the Regular School Board Meeting held on April 14, 2026, as printed. 2) Bills totaling \$43,910.34 from the General Fund, \$91,668.03 from the Debt Fund, \$12,320.93 from the Food Service Fund, \$22,132.98 from the Student Activities Fund, Check Register (Ck. #'s 55727-55816), and May payroll totaling \$419,504.52. North Dakota Local Government Groups Call for Renewed Civility in Public Discourse

Bismarck, ND —

A partnership of North Dakota organizations representing cities, counties, and parks has released a letter titled The Future of Local Government: A Call for Civility and is calling on residents to engage in more civil and respectful dialogue with local elected officials.

The groups cite a growing trend of hostility toward local leaders, including increased confrontational behavior and, in some cases, threats directed at public officials and staff.

“Local government works best when people can engage in productive, respectful conversations,” the coalition said in a joint statement. “Our communities face complex challenges that require collaboration—not conflict.”

The organizations emphasize that local elected officials are

members of the community who are working to make difficult decisions on issues ranging from infrastructure development to public services.

The coalition encourages North Dakotans to participate in local decision-making while maintaining respect, seeking accurate information, and focusing on constructive solutions.
