Auditor Deborah Banish; James Fust and Scott Haan, residents of Rutland.

County Assessor Hayen discussed the market adjustments on properties within the City.

Lysne/Erickson moved to approve the four Veterans Credit and three Homestead credits as presented by the County Assessor. Motion carried unanimously.

Lysne/McLaen moved to approve the Assessment books as presented. Motion carried unanimously.
