The regular City Council meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM by Mayor Kevin Bopp. Present were council members, Luke Anderson, Kirk Flihs, and John Stenvold. Also attending were City Auditor Alicia Thompson, City Superintendent Donavon Hajek, City Coordinator Sara Dux.

Guest/ Public Comments: Mayor of the Day Dylan Gulleon and Zach Hatting from Interstate Engineering

Dylan Gulleon led everyone in the pledge of allegiance, Dylan won the essay contest for mayor of the day.

Zach with Interstate Engineering was present to discuss the Main Street milling, overlay, and sidewalk project, for which the City will be awarded Prairie Dog Fund funding.


