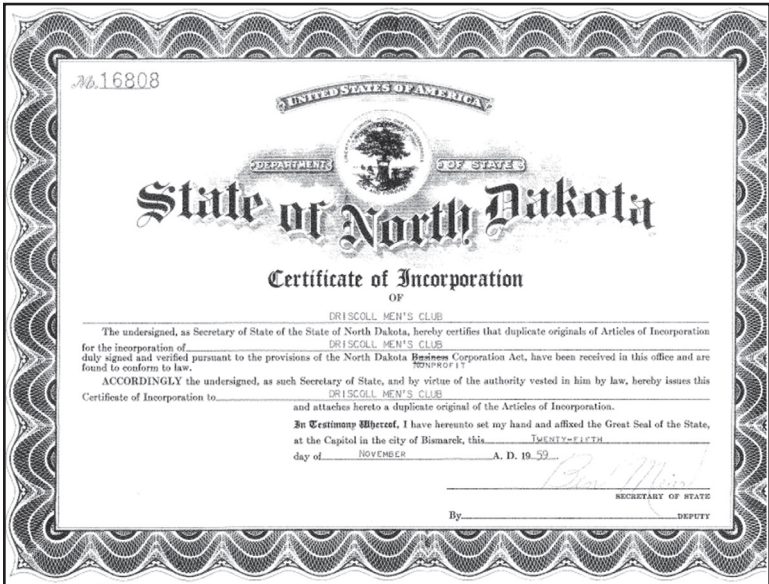

(thanks Jean) Over the years, there were hundreds of active members and there were over 50 members at it's height. A lot of meetings were held over a light lunch of freshly cut sandwich meat from Norm's Grocery. It was said at that last meeting they couldn't remember many times when Floyd Seibel or Lloyd

Quale missed a meeting, many others were mentioned too. It'd be hard to mention names as there were so many active members who gave up a lot of their time and sweat to make the club thrive for as long as it did. They did it for the love of the community and community pride. The town is left in good hands as they have a wildlife club and the betterment club who continue to keep the community alive and make sure there is fun had by all in Driscoll. These groups put on suppers, host the 4th of July celebrations, and raise money for activities and to buy (and build) things the town
