The North Dakota Game & Fish Department announces the following summary of regulations and changes for the 2026-2028 fishing proclamation.

HOOK AND LINE, BOW (ARCHERY), SPEAR AND UNDERWATER SPEARFISHING
 Hook and line, bow, spear and underwater spearfishing is legal from Apr. 1 - Mar. 31 of each fishing year. See proclamation for species legal to take.
DARKHOUSE SPEAR AND BOW (ARCHERY) FISHING
 Darkhouse spear and bow fishing is legal from ice up through Mar. 15 of each fishing year.
 See proclamation for species legal to take.
 Darkhouse spear & bow fishing is legal only on certain waters.
PADDLEFISH SNAGGING
 Paddlefish snagging is legal May 1 through May 21 of each fishing year, in certain areas of the Missouri and Yellowstone rivers. Snaggers must possess a valid tag.
 Snagging paddlefish shall be legal only from 7 am to 7 pm (Central Time) each day. Snaggers must immediately release all paddlefish on Snag and Release Days and immediately tag their one paddlefish on Harvest Days.

- SUMMARY OF CHANGES FOR 2026-2028**
- Allows for the use of white sucker as legal live baitfish on the Missouri River System, Lake Audubon, Devils Lake and Stump Lake.
 - Allows for the harvest of chinook salmon with the reinitiation of a snagging season. Also, allows for the harvest of salmon with archery and spearing equipment during the new snagging season.
 - The requirement to register before participating in darkhouse spearfishing is eliminated.
 - The white bass daily and possession limits are increased to 30 and 60, respectively.
 - Paddlefish tags are available for purchase online and at the Bismarck, Dickinson and Williston offices from 8 am-5 pm., Monday through Friday. Online purchases should accommodate for appropriate delivery time.

FREE FISHING DAYS Residents of North Dakota may fish without a resident fishing license on Jun. 6-7, 2026, Dec. 26-27, 2026, Jun. 5-6, 2027 and Dec. 26-27, 2027.

Be An Informed Voter

Is your Republican legislator voting more like the most conservative legislator or more like the most liberal legislator? By the same token, is your Democrat legislator voting more like the most liberal legislator or more like the most conservative legislator? This article will help

you find out in short order. To find out, I suggest you go to <https://leginate.com/>. Once there wait a short time for it to load and then click on the page. A new page will appear. Click on the legislative assembly for the year you're interested in as far back as 2015. Next, select either the

"Senate" or "House". After this click "Submit." Legislators will then be ranked on a continuum from "Left of Center Democrat" to "Right of Center Republican." Then by clicking on the bar above a legislator's name, one can see "Sponsored Bills" as well as "Vote Deviations." In addition, one can also see if your legislator is voting more like the "Votes Matched to Most Liberal" or "Votes Matched to the Most Conservative." I was surprised to see that well over half of the Republicans in the state legislature vote more like the most liberal member than like the most conservative member.

I hope this article will entice some of you to check on how strong of a Republican or how strong of a Democrat your legislator is. This activity will help those who use it to be a more informed voter. I know the first time I used it; I was surprised at my legislators voting record. I hope many of you check this site prior to voting in the primary election on June 9th.
