Digestive Support Bone Broth Soup

Ingredients

- 4 cups homemade or storebought bone broth
- 1 onion, diced
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 inch turmeric, grated (or 1 tsp. turmeric powder)
- 1 inch ginger, grated (or 1 tsp. ginger powder)
- 1 cup shredded chicken, optional
- 2 T. apple cider vinegar
- ½ tsp. sea salt
- ½ tsp. pepper
- 1 T. olive oil or butter
- ½ cup sauerkraut, for topping

Instructions

1. In a large pot, heat olive oil or butter over medium heat. Sauté onion, garlic, turmeric and ginger.
2. Pour in bone broth and vinegar and bring to a simmer. Add shredded chicken, cooking for another 10 minutes. Season with sea salt and pepper, ladle into bowls and serve with a spoonful of sauerkraut.

NOTE: Topping the soup with sauerkraut adds probiotics for an extra gut-health boost

Notice to Residents of Steele

Pursuant to City Ordinance, 174 tall grasses exceeding six inches in height are declared a nuisance and it is the duty of every person owning, occupying, or in charge of any premises, lot, or parcel of land to keep those premises free from tall grass. Starting May 1st each year, through October 1st, each year. Steele City employees will check any grass heights they may think exceed six inches. If found to be in violation of this ordinance Steele City employees will cause the nuisance to be abated. The cost of the abatement will be the responsibility of the person responsible for the property.
